
GREEN THUMB GARDENING



By CHRISTINE COLE SEED SAVING MAKE IT WORTHWHILE

While cleaning up your garden plants this season you may have found it too hard to resist to collect a few handfuls of seeds from your favorite plants. However, before you store them away for the winter there is a few rules that you should be aware of for next. season's success.

First and most important is that you should not collect and save seeds from hybrid plants. There are many plants that are hybrids, now. The seed package or plant packet tag will indicate if it is a hybrid. Hybrids are produced by crossing two different parents. Therefore, hybrids that cross with each other in the garden do produce seeds, but the plant that seed produces will not be the same as the plant that you originally grew. Confusing isn't it! Basically, seeds produced by hybrid plants do not reproduce true to type, the next season.

Also, it is not advisable to collect seeds from similar species that have been close together. For example, if various squashes were grown in close proximity then collecting the seeds may not be worthwhile. They will have been cross pollinated resulting in different progeny.

Always collect seeds from mature and ripe fruit. Leave one or more fruit on the plant to grow and reach full maturity before harvesting the seeds. Some fruits such as green peppers are picked and eaten when still unripe. They will turn red when they are ripe. Seeds from fleshy fruits such as pepper and squash may need some cleaning to remove the pulp from around the seeds. Soaking and washing them in water will make this easier. Let them dry on a sheet for 2 days, then store them in a cool, dry place, in a sealed container. A refrigerator is ideal. Stored in this manner the seeds will remain viable for several seasons.
