

Football Rebels earning respect

In only six short years, Randy Marinangeli and the Georgetown Rebels senior football coaching staff have put together a competitive football program that has faired well against Halton Regional opponents in recent years.

Head coach Marinangeli came to Georgetown District High School six years ago with a great deal of knowledge on the sport of football and a desire to put together a program.

His knowledge and coaching abilities have helped the Rebels post successful season the past two years, with the help of defensive co-ordinator Terry Elik and offensive assistant coach Chris Sargent.

After three years of losing seasons (a lack of players forced the end of the senior team in 1989), the Rebels came away with a 4-2 season record last season and a 3-3 regular season record this year.

The defensive unit, led by middle linebacker Rob Elmslie, was strong all season. Brad Fisher, Mark McIntyre, and Mike Hergaarden came up with impressive performances as did Jamie Priddle and Joe Beaver.

Making up the rest of the senior team this season were: Darryl Casselman, Chris Crawford, Ken MacKenzie, Paul McKeeman, Jeff Sandifer, Scott Hobbs, Jim Dimitriou, Darby Oram, Mark Lockwood, Jason Bouwman, Dave Blyth, and Dolf Dejong.

Marinangeli explains that his team's success is anything but a single effort, that Elik and Sargent are effective dedicated coaches that have helped his efforts tremendously.

This past weekend they played two of their best games of the season, according to coach Paul LaRose, but had to settle for two draws.


The last time the Raiders met Ancaster, they outscored them by six goals, however last Saturday when the two teams faced off again, hometown Ancaster came out much stronger.
