Snow takes Halton Hills by storm

Halton Hills public works employees were out since early Thursday morning attempting to stay ahead of the storm that dumped several inches of snow in the area.

Don Swackhamer, public works foreman, says they were well prepared for the storm, and had every available man and plow out on the roads.

"We went out Thursday morning until 10:30 p.m. and we were back out at 4 a.m. Friday morning," said Swackhamer. "(At press time) It's still storming and we are not gaining too much. We are keeping the main arteries open."

The town had all three graders and nine plows and sanders out.

Swackhamer says he estimated about 15 inches of snow had fallen in Acton by early Friday morning.

"We received more snow in this

storm than we have in storms over the past four or five years."

Despite the treacherous road conditions Halton police reported that there had not been many accidents in Halton Hills.

Desk clerk Sandra Cousens said

Friday morning that there had only been a few minor fender-benders and no extra staff had been brought in. "I think the people are being extra careful on the roads, or they're staying at home," said Cousens.

Tools and car stolen

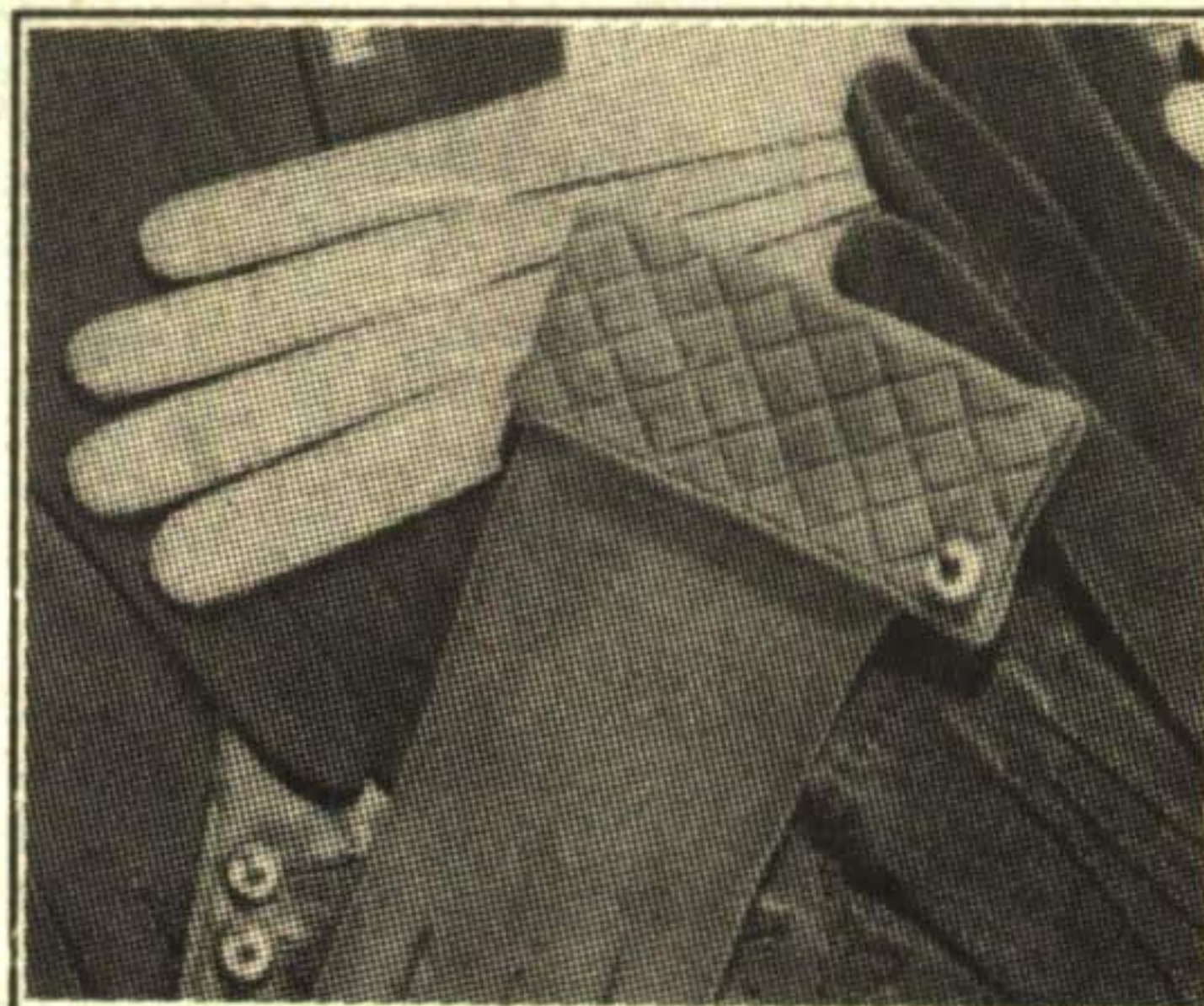
