The stained glass windows in the Gallery of the Cultural Centre are nearly all back in place, as Kathy Parker (above) of Robert McCausland Ltd. installed some of the panels, Monday. The large window will be fully installed within the next two weeks. At the same time, members of Arts Alive and LACAC assembled with Town staff as they made a presentation of \$5,000 to the Town of Halton Hills to help cover the cost of the renovation.
