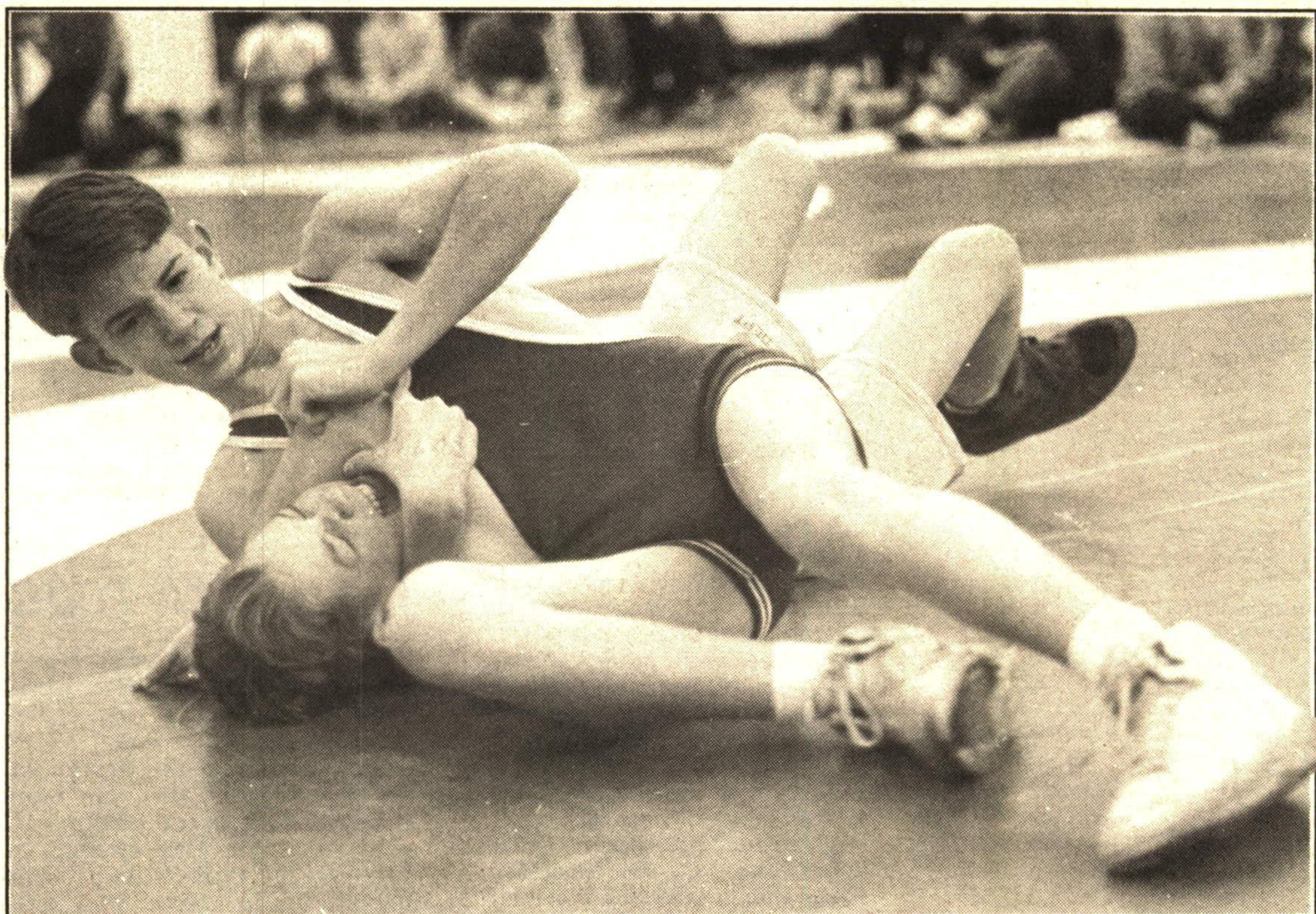
Bridge winners

"It was a good tournament. The competition was excellent and our boys performed very well," said

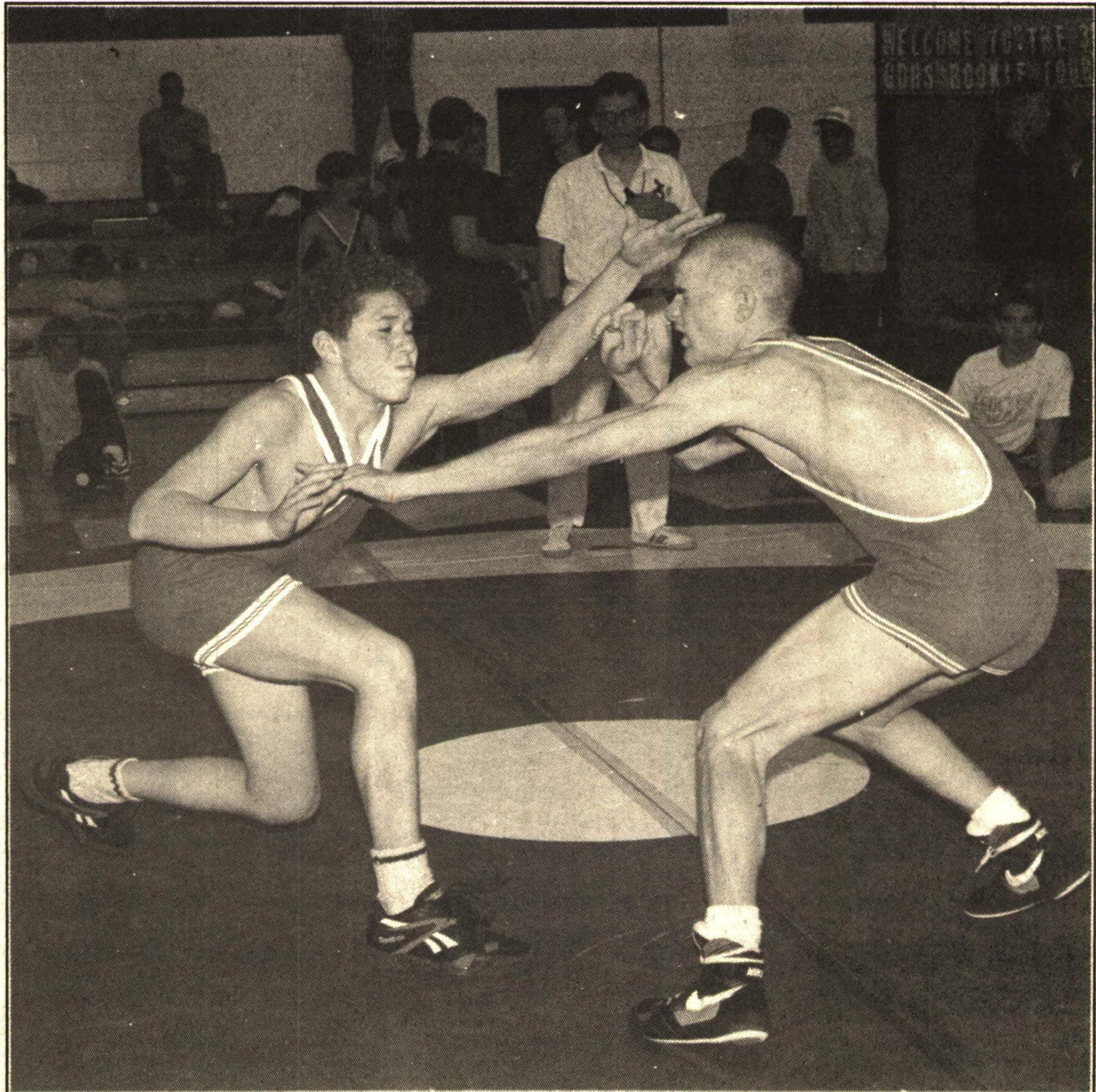
Rebel wrestler coach Jim Hall.
