Funding for the Oakville Bronte waterfront redevelopment project would dry up, he predicted, and the future of the proposed new regional museum in Milton, the \$7-million Halton Heritage Centre, would also be uncertain.

The treasurer said future capital expansions to area hospitals will be a tough sell. Halton funds one-third of such work. Burlington's Joseph Brant Hospital is contemplating expansion, and there are renovations planned for the Georgetown District Hospital.

The police budget for 1993 is up \$2.2 million to \$40 million, a 5.9 per cent increase. More than 50 per cent of that is reflected in employee contract and benefit packages.

The former Halton Centennial Manor, now called Allendale, eats up an additional \$676,000 for annualized operation and financing of the newly refurbished facility. Allendale recently completed \$18 million in renovations. Another \$310,000 increase is earmarked to fund welfare, a system still under extreme financial pressure due to the recession. Also on the social services side, \$150,000 in new funding is being supplied to the Halton Children's Aid Society. Caseloads are up there too, thanks largely to the recession.

The Bronte Harbour project, a \$19-million undertaking to be phased over several years, is allotted \$182,600 in 1993.




