

Bodanis Raiders suffer three straight defeats

After putting together a record of eight wins against two losses in their last ten games the Bodanis Raiders hit the skids in late December with three losses, one each to league leaders Orangeville and Hamilton, and the third to Burlington.

On December 19, at home

against Burlington, the Raiders found themselves down three goals in the first, fought back to even with three of their own in the second, but were unable to continue the rally and gave two back in the third for a 5-3 loss.

Georgetown's Brad Spears scored the first of Georgetown's

three goals at 0:53 of the second period assisted by Paul Agius and Tim Diardichuk. Paul Sandifer scored the second at 0:30 assisted by Jamie Briggs and Andrew Elinesky the third with just five seconds left in the period from Briggs and David Boere.

Burlington scored twice in the third to smother the Georgetown rally and take the two points.

The next afternoon the Bodanis Bantams welcomed the Hamilton Wings to Alcott, and for the second game in a row posted their opponents to a three goal lead before putting one of their own on the board.

From there on out both teams traded goals and Georgetown found themselves on the south side of a 6-3 score for their second loss in as many days.

The Raiders' first came from Paul Sandifer assisted by David Boere at 11:46 of the second narrowing the Hamilton lead to 3-1.

Hamilton replied at 7:31 to regain their three goal edge.

Brad Spears scored Georgetown's second at 4:14 of the period on a nice set up from Paul Agius to close out the middle frame down 4-2.

Hamilton hit first at 14:13 of the third followed ten seconds later by Raider Andrew Elinesky's goal from David Boere and a minute later by the Wings' sixth for the 6-3 final.

On Monday, December 21 the Raiders travelled north to Orangeville for a rematch against the league leaders who had thumped the Raiders at Alcott just 11 days earlier.

In this game Georgetown reversed recent trends jumping out to an early 3-0 lead.

Unfortunately they were unable to weather a 44 shot attack by the Orangemen who came back to win this one 7-6.

Raiders' netminder Steve Heinz turned in a strong performance for the Red and Black and Paul Sandifer had a great offensive night with four goals plus one assist for five points.

Andrew Elinesky and Paul Agius scored the other Georgetown goals. Gary McNiven, Elinesky, David Boere and Tim Diardichuk picked up assists.

The Bodanis Raiders' season totals took quite a beating over this three game skid but they still remain four games over five hundred with a 12-8-2 record.

Stan Rhynold hit two 140s and Brad Youmans hit 134. Bruce Capriol started three and closed out 84. Mike Hope scored 135, Ted Musgrove scored 126, 116 and Gord Nokes scored 121 to round off the highlights.
