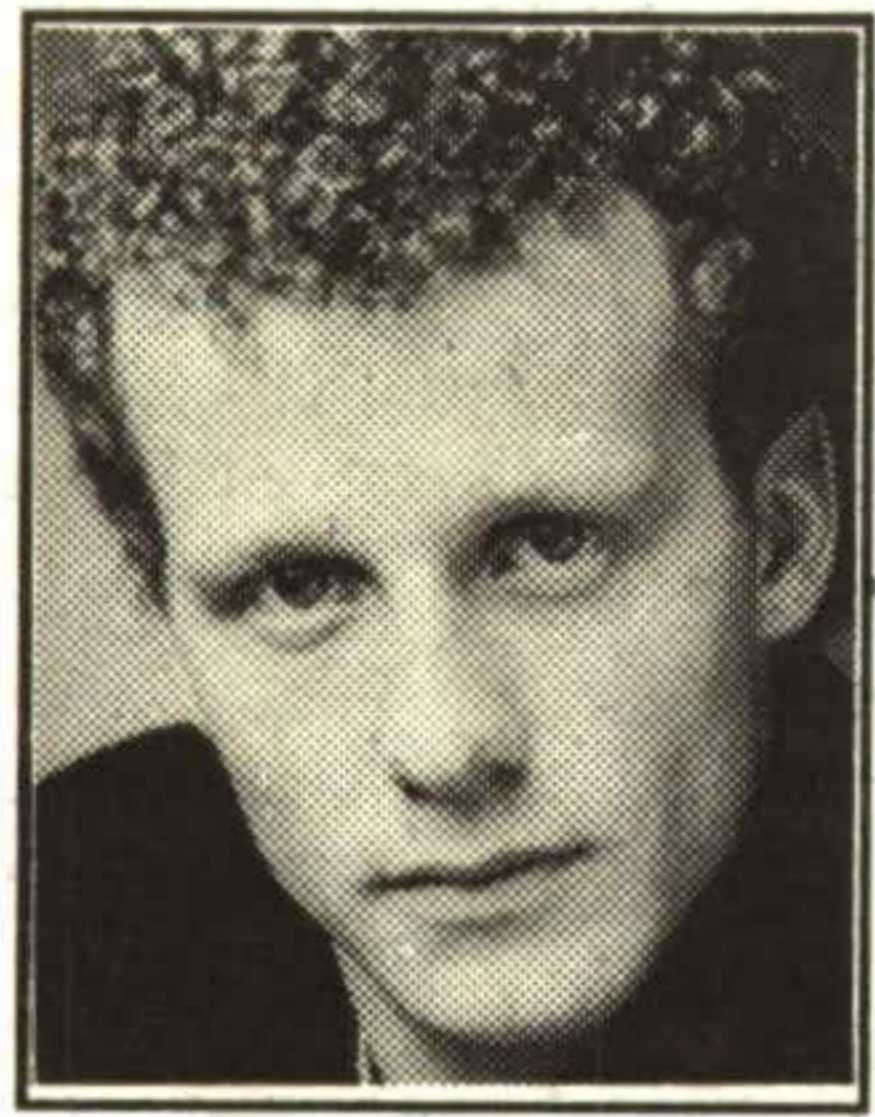

The Halton Hills Camera Club is getting ready for the 1993 juried exhibition of photographic art.

Photoart '93 is open to all residents of Halton Hills. There are prizes available for both black and white and color prints in the following categories:

1. people and animals;
2. scenery and architecture;
3. abstract.

To be entered, your prints must be larger than 5x7 inches but smaller than 16x20 inches and be mount-

ed on a white board with a margin of between 2 and 3 inches. The prints cannot be matted or framed.

You may enter up to nine prints, but if you enter, you must enter at least two pictures. The entry fee is \$3 per print.

Your prints must be offered for sale, and the Halton Hills Camera Club takes a 25 per cent commission from any sales to help cover the cost of running the show.

You can enter your prints between February 1 and February

24, at the NRS Brand Realty Office on Mountainview Rd. N., Georgetown during their regular office hours.

The awards will be presented Wednesday, March 3, at 8 p.m. in the Gallery of the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre. The prints will be on display to the public from March 3 to 27.

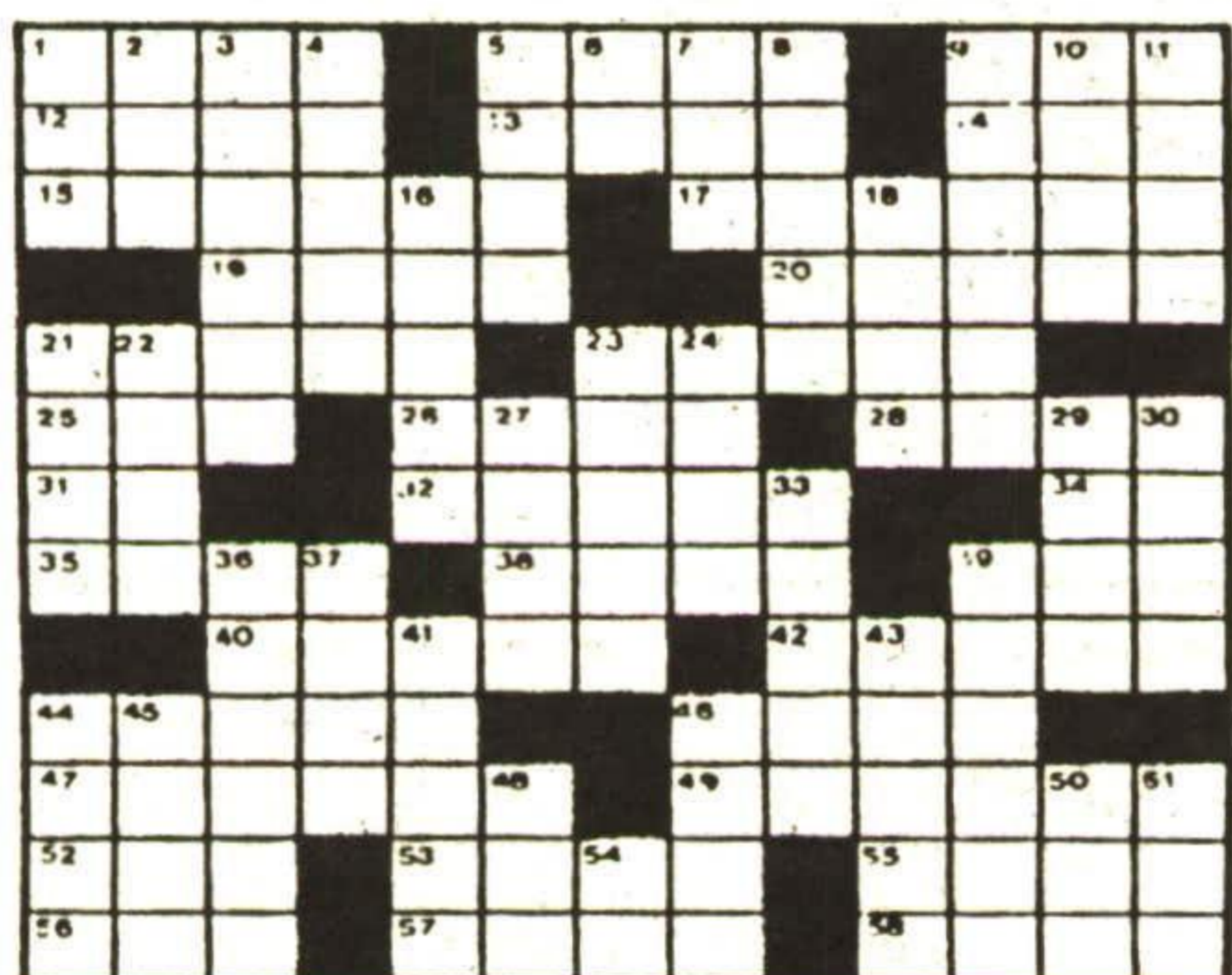
