Raiders end winless streak at 35

Finally, after more than threeand-a-half months of disappointment and frustration, the Georgetown Chrysler Raiders snapped their dismal 35-game winless streak Wednesday night in Royal York with a big 7-2 win over the seventh place Royal York Rangers.

This gave Georgetown its first ice victory since their third game of the season on October 3, when they took down Royal York 6-5 on home ice.

While they still remain stationed in the basement of the Central Ontario Junior A West Division standings, the win moved the Raiders two points up on Royal York, who hold onto the last playoff spot.

Georgetown is now four points behind the Rangers and have a 5-33-1 season record (one win coming on a protest against Caledon for use of an illegal player).

Raider GM Finn Poulstrup said the game was a turning point for the team and that the players now realize the personal commitment it take to win.

"It was a real character game for us," said Poulstrup, "I saw more effort from the guys Wednesday night than I had seen in over two months."


Royal York's only other goal came at 13:33 of the second by Peter Westercamp.



The teams met in Barrie on Friday night and in Halton on Saturday.






Athletes of the Week
