

Doubleheaders turn the tables

The Industrial league has certainly taken a dramatic turn since the double headers came into force, with still a few more in the schedule. In the last two weeks leading challengers to the Hustlers, Gasketman Cutters, have faltered. The shortage of players has contributed to the demise from second to fourth place in the standings. Having lost all 14 points two Wednesdays ago, this past Wednesday saw a miniature comeback with six points from 14. However those above, leaders Hustlers, Steeprock and Westenders played well enough to pull away just a little more.

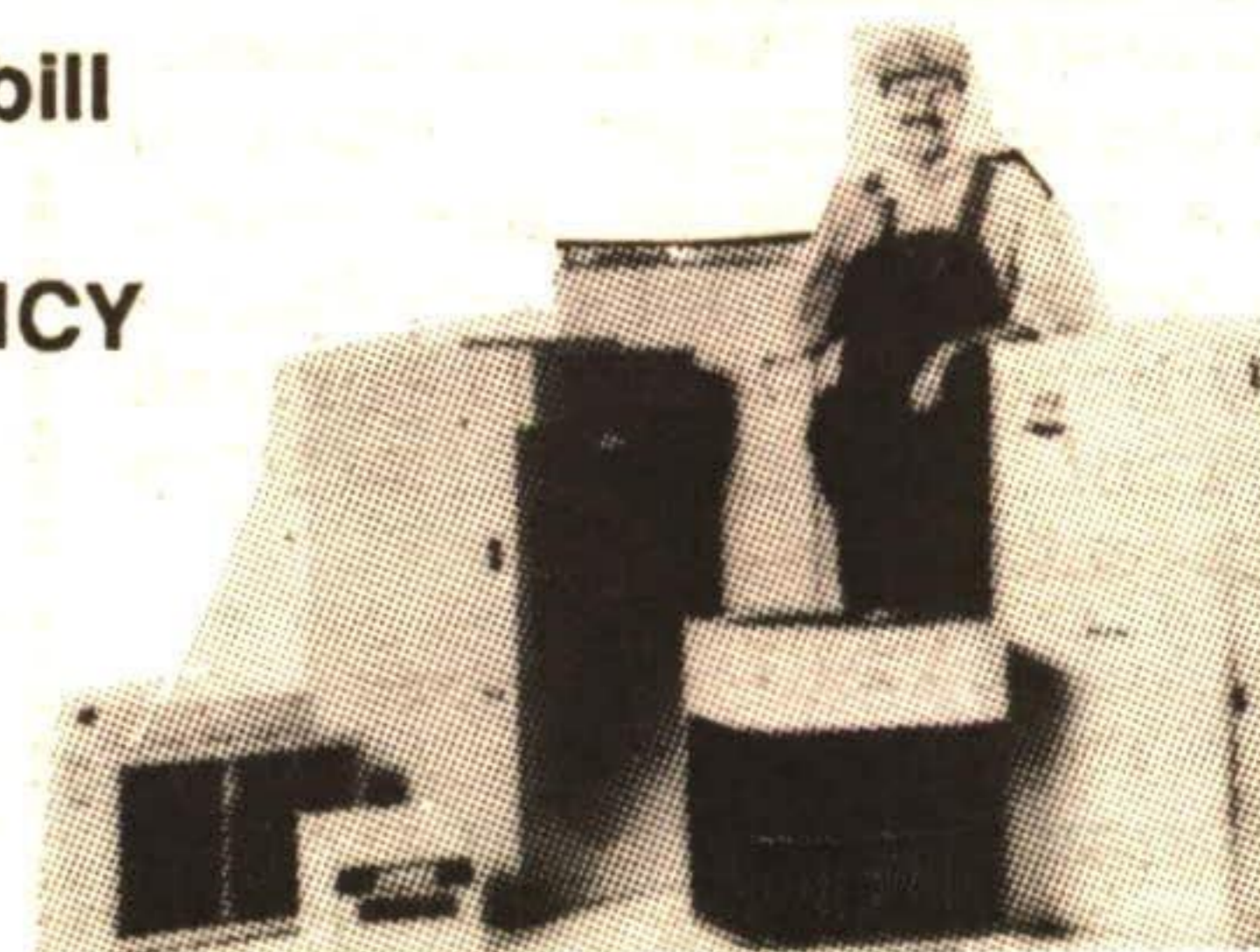

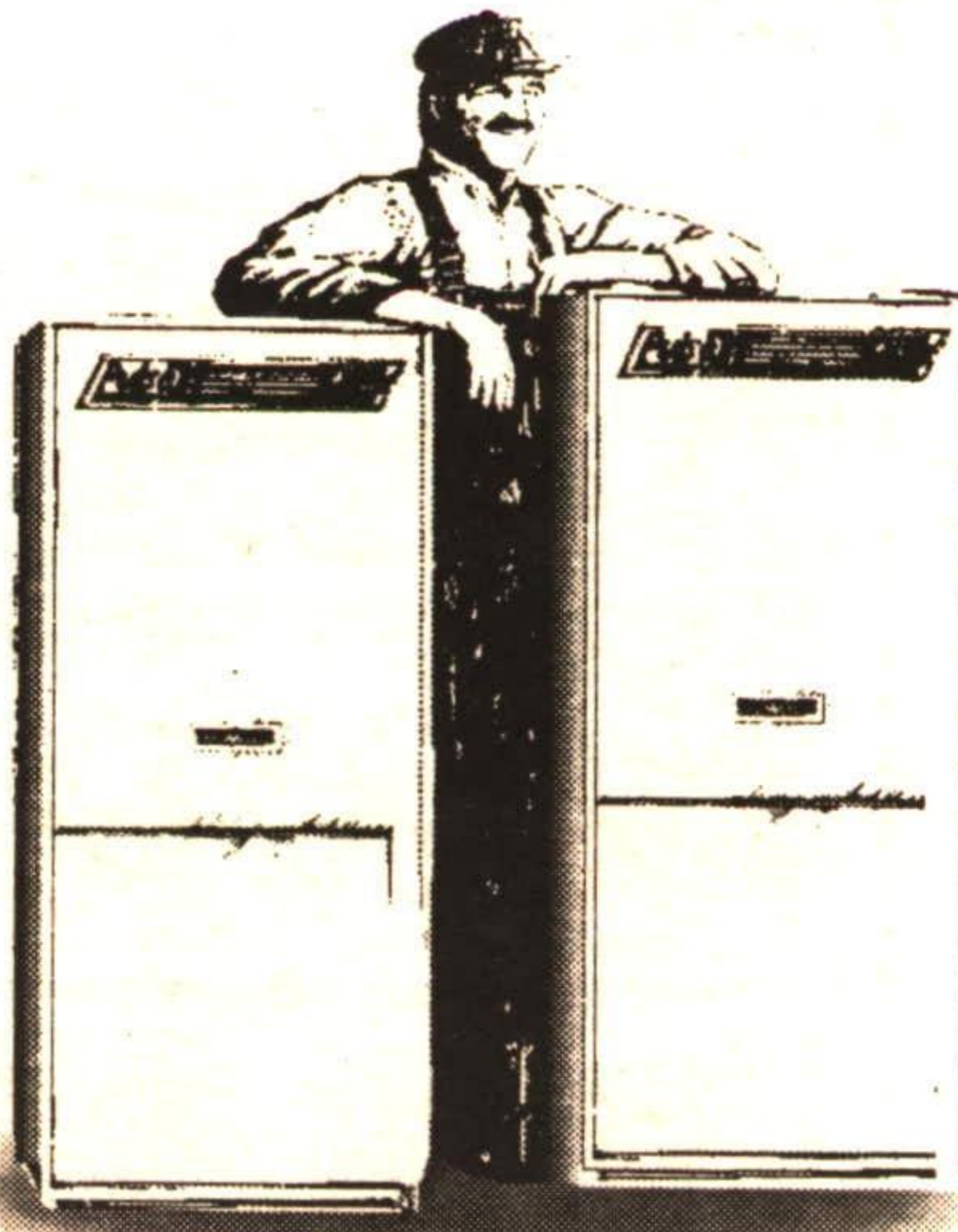
