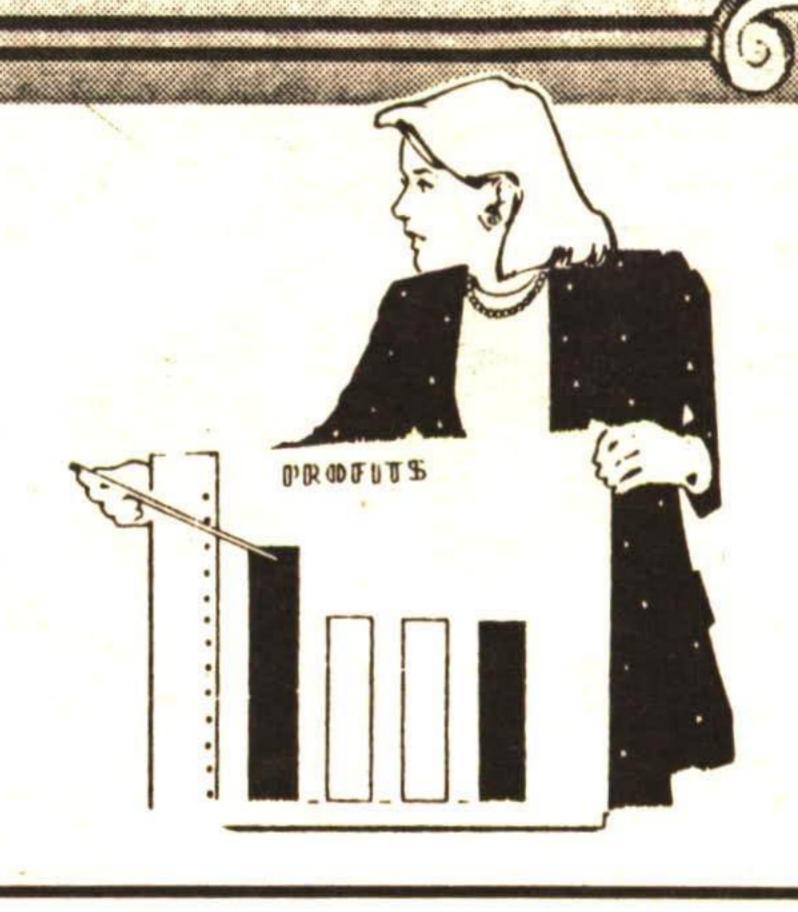
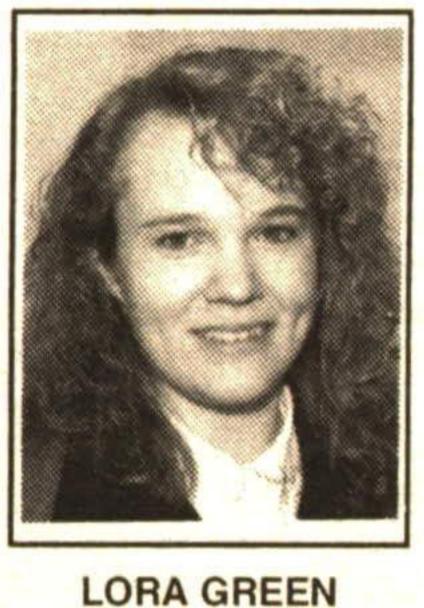

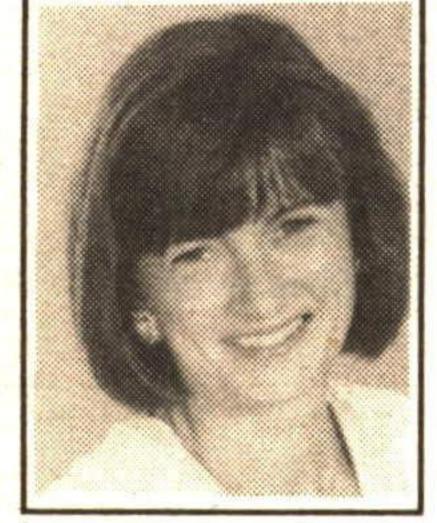
Green remembers building clientele as the hardest part of starting her business. Once she had accomplished that, the rest was easy.

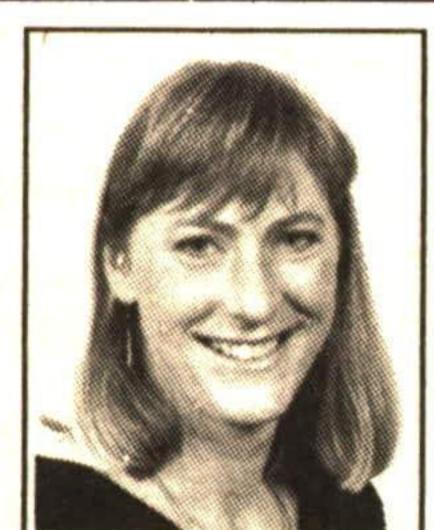

But today, the owner of Silvercreek Photography is still applying the basic principals she learned in her early art classes, to her style of photography.

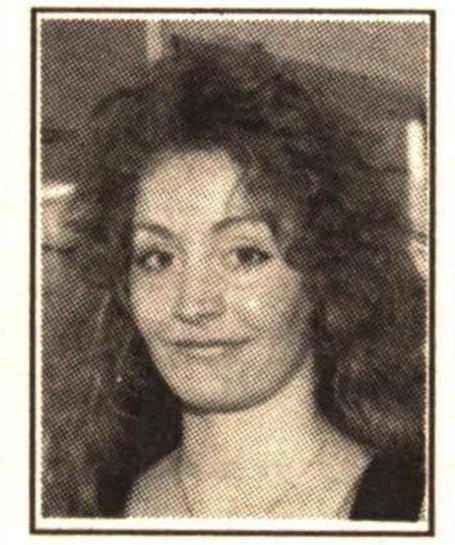

At present, Anna Christine carries a small selection of lingerie to compliment new hair styles.

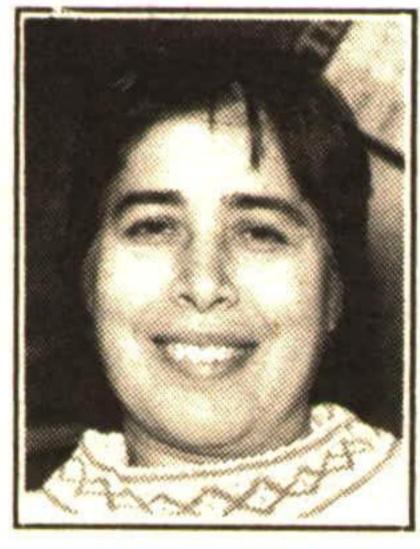
