
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

Steinem speaks in Guelph

Gloria Steinem, perhaps North America's best known feminist, will speak in Peter Clark Hall, University of Guelph on Wednesday, March 10, at 8 p.m. Steinem will discuss her latest book, 1992's bestseller "Revolution From Within."

Gloria Steinem is a frequent spokesperson on issues of equality. She is currently an editorial consultant and writer for "Ms. Magazine," the national feminist bi-monthly that she co-founded in 1972. Her writing has also appeared in many other magazines, newspapers and anthologies here and abroad.

Steinem has served as founder, board member or adviser for organizations including the Ms. Foundation for Women, the only national, multi-issue, multi-racial public women's fund; the National Women's Political Caucus, a nonpartisan group devoted to advancing pro-equality women of all races in elected and appointed office; and Votes for Choice, a non-partisan political action committee that supports pro-choice candidates.






