Red Cross first aid course

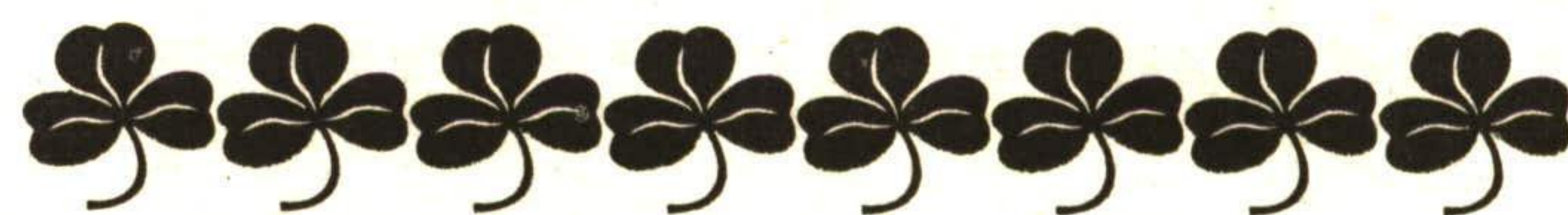

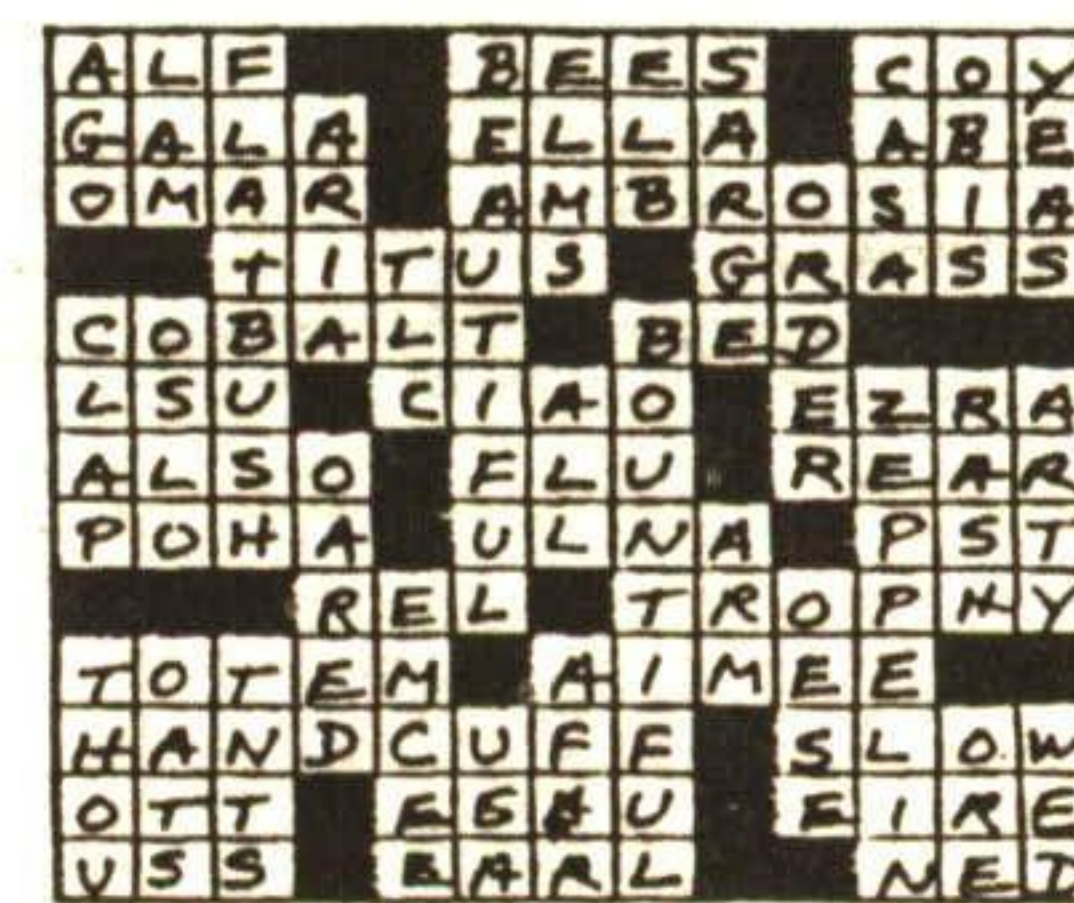

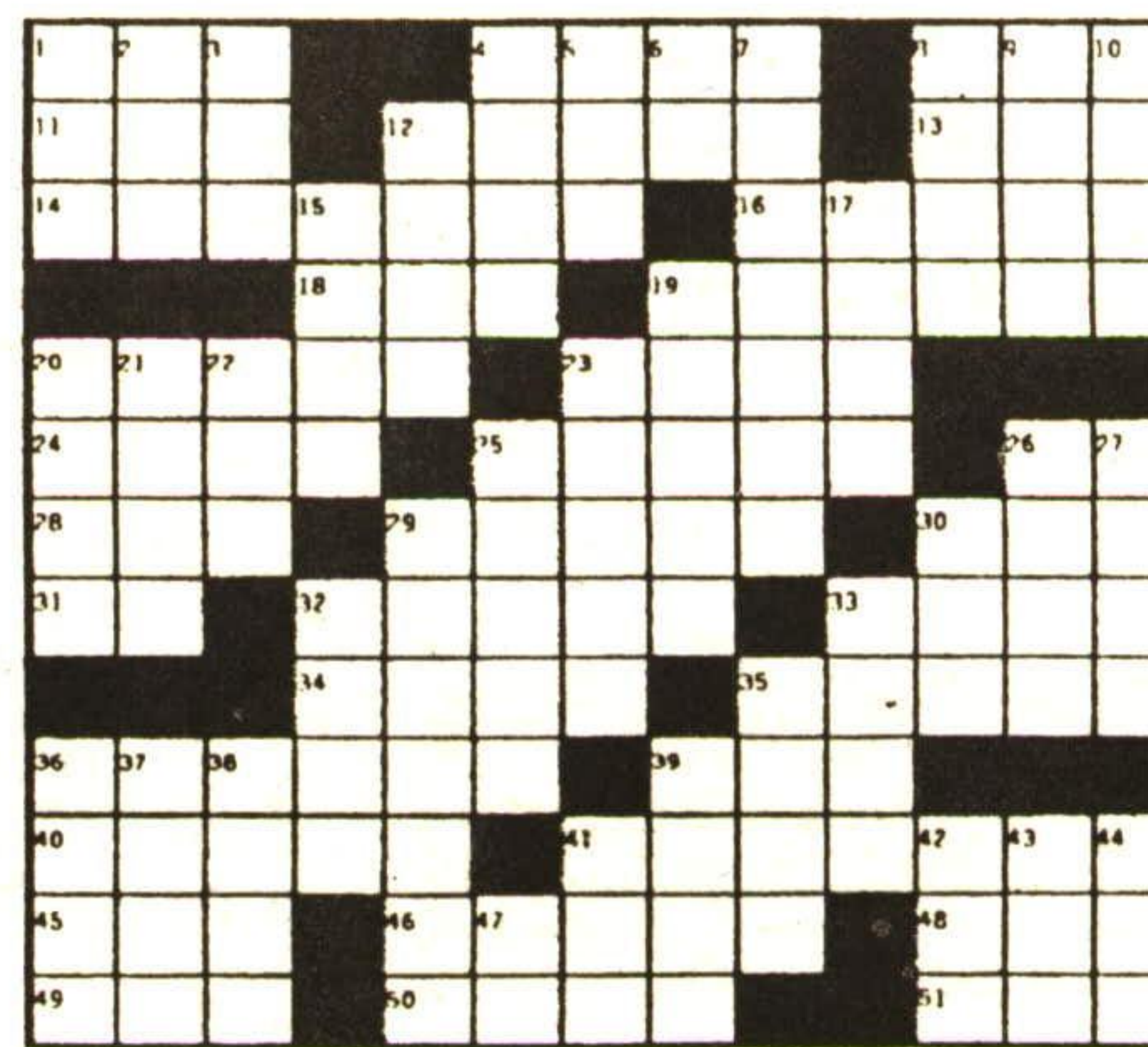
