EQUITY MUTUAL FUNDS ON THE MOVE

More and more of the economic evidence is serving to verify the fact that not only has the recession ended, but that the recovery is gaining speed. Typically, when this happens, investors in equity mutual funds are well rewarded. A strong case in point are the equity funds managed by Mackenzie Financial Corporation. In fact, history has shown that Mackenzie's Industrial Group of Fund may be one of the best leading indicators available.

Mackenzie managed funds are performing well above the TSE 300 Index in recent months. This pattern is similar to those exhibited during previous recoveries. The largest gains have been in Universal Natural Resource Fund (up 50.1% December 1, 1992 to March 15, 1993) and Industrial Equity Fund (up 33.9% over the same period), which are capturing the gains in smaller resource companies that accompany early recovery stages. The larger funds in the group, such as Industrial Horizon Fund (up and Industrial 12.2%) Growth Fund (up 17.0%), are showing strong movement relative to market, and are benefiting from a patient and disciplined restructuring to producer stocks over several years. While this restructuring came at the price of shortterm performance, Mackenzie resisted pressure to deviate from their outlook - and this has started to pay dividends. Mackenzie has highlighted Natural Resources and Industrial Products as the leadership sectors for this recovery.

This may be the beginning of another period of strong performance in Canadian equity funds, and now is a good time to invest if you are not already participating.

According to the Halton branch of the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA), unemployment is associated with a number of related problems, such as increased major and minor illnesses, depression, anxiety, and family violence. Despite this, there is still little systematic support for the unemployed. They are generally left on their own to rationalize the job loss and handle the many problems which arise. Various organizations offer assistance in resume writing and job search skills, but few offer the emotional and practical assistance people need when coping with unemployment over extended

In response to this need, the CMHA presents its first ever Handling Unemployment Group (HUGS). A six-week series of lectures and group support is being offered in Acton and is open to all those who have become unemployed in the past two years. This group is designed to capitalize on the individual's strengths, yet also recog-

nizes the value of mutual support. Facilitators encourage members to share, in a supportive environment, their concerns and identify their needs

Discussion topics include stress management, dealing with family and friends, handling depression, assertiveness and communication skills and job search techniques. These issues are handled in a variety of ways such as group discussions and guest speakers.

Although as a community agency we cannot create jobs or stop the rising number of the jobless, we can help to support people through some of the personal problems associated with unemployment. The CMHA believes it is important to assist people experiencing this difficult process and give them the support needed to come through it with their self esteem intact

The HUGS group will be held on Wednesday, March 24, 1-3 p.m. at the Acton Community Social Services Offices. There is no fee for this course, but registration is required. To register contact Lin Sally at 853-3310.
