## Conference to discuss women's health study

After talking with more than 300 women, and providers of health and social services in Halton the Halton District Health Council has discovered several health issues of concern to women.

"We feel confident that we have a clear sense of what women want and need to support their health," said Marlene Longdon, executive director of the District Health Council.

Five common issues arose during this first phase of a Women's Health Study undertaken by the health council. The \$50,000 study funded by the Ministry of Health got underway in September.

The study focused on six areas of health that concern women including reproductive health, reproductive disorders, chronic and degenerative diseases, mental health and addictions, violence against women, women and cancer and lifestyle and environmental impacts on health.

Opinions of the women were gathered through public forums, interviews, focus group sessions, TV talk shows and through phone calls. Two forums were held in Halton Hills.

One of the issues that arose was that women felt that there was limited access to services which support emotional health.

"That could include professional counseling, peer support, mental illnesses and coping with chronic diseases," said Jane Sanders, assistant

executive director of the Health Council.

Sanders said that a lack of a holistic approach by health professionals to women's issues was another issue raised.

"During the study women complained of a lack of appropriate health information available.

Another issue raised was that there were barriers to accessing services. This was a big concern for north Halton women. Lack of a bus service in Acton and Georgetown was cited as a barrier.

The fifth issue raised was the insufficient attention to prevention.

The next step in the Women's Health Study is a Women's Health Conference set for Saturday April 3 in the auditorium at the Halton Regional Building in Oakville.

The free conference is intended to provide the council with an opportunity to report back to the Region the findings of the first phase of the study and to ask women and service providers for their ideas on addressing the issues raised in the study.

The schedule will include a presentation of the study's findings by Longdon, June Engel from the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine discussing Sharing Health Information, Empowering Teens Toward Better Health, Midwifery Care, Women Helping Women, Building Partnerships for Better Health and a networking luncheon.

Cost for the luncheon is \$7.50. To register for the conference call the Halton District Health Council at 842-2120.

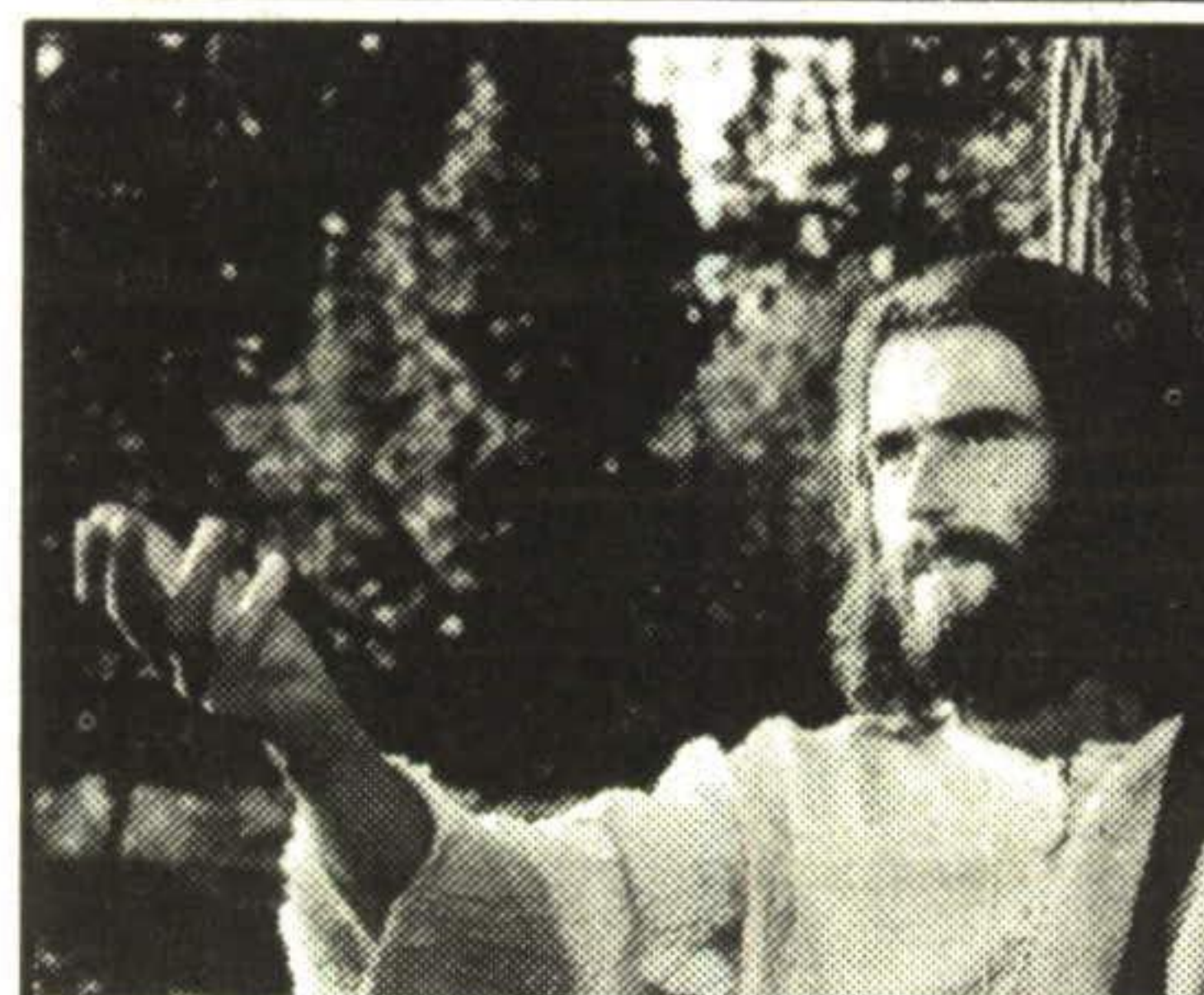

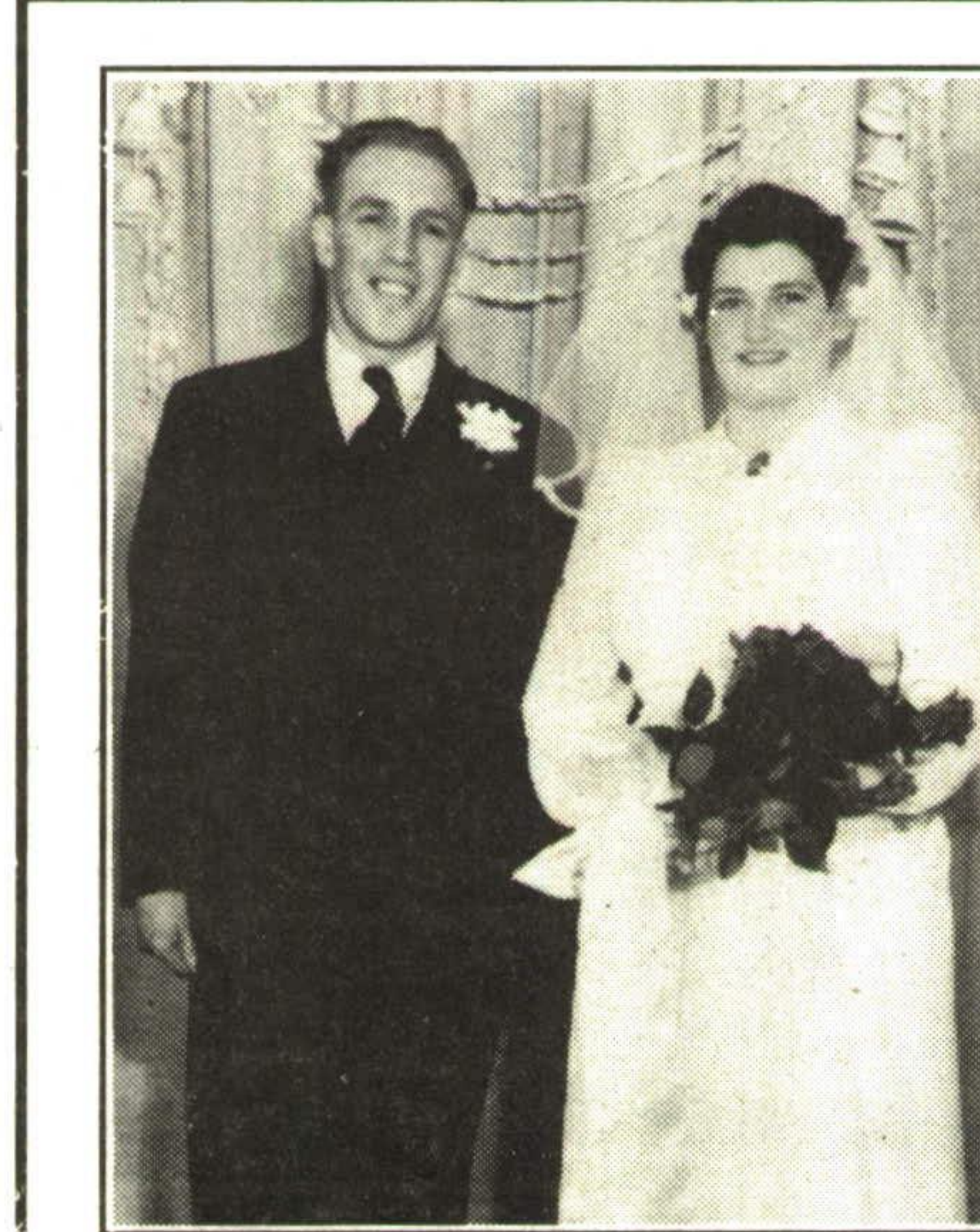
