





### 1993 SPRING YARD & GARDEN COLLECTION SCHEDULE

The Town of Halton Hills is once again providing a curbside collection program for the collection of yard and garden wastes.

Materials such as grass clippings, flower stalks, leaves and other related materials are acceptable for pick up. Brush put at the curb for collection should be tied or bundled in lengths no greater than 4 feet (1.2 m). Twigs and branches should not exceed 1/2 inch (12 mm) in diameter.

Please place your yard and garden materials at the curbside in clear plastic bags before 7:30 a.m. on the following days:

> April 5 June 7 April 19 June 14 May 3 June 28 May 17 July 5

The diversion of these materials from landfill will help Halton Hills attain the Province of Ontario's goal of 50% diversion of waste by the year 2000.
