

Open air burning restricted in town

Halton Hills Fire Department advises that open air burning within the municipality is restricted.

The Ontario Fire Code, Article 2.6.3.4. states, "Open air burning shall not be permitted unless approved, or unless such burning consists of a small confined fire, supervised at all times, and used to cook food on a grill or a barbecue."

In accordance with this regulation made under the Fire Marshals Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 166, open air burning is not permitted unless approved by the Chief Fire Official.

Within the Town of Halton Hills approval is provided in written form only by the "Permit To Conduct Open Air Burning."

Permits are available at no cost through the Halton Hills Fire Department, Fire Prevention Division at 877-1133. Please allow a minimum of 48 hours for the inspection of the proposed burn site.

Community gardens planned for Acton area

Recently, several concerned citizens associated with the Christian Reform Church, the Acton Horticultural Society, and the Acton Foodshare Program have come together, to organize community garden areas in the Acton

A community garden area is subdivided into sections or plots, and leased to individuals for a \$10 annual fee. The funds are used to support the watering equipment and plowing costs. Each garden

plot is the sole responsibility of the individual, for planting, harvesting, maintaining proper weeding, cultivation (excluding the initial annual plowing), and watering.

This garden concept can provide people like apartment dwellers with land access for gardening, which they otherwise would not have.

The emphasis is on vegetable gardening, but not restricted to this type.

Gardening can be very reward-

ing, and a healthy form of recreation. The Acton Horticultural Society is pleased to participate with anyone interested in leasing a garden plot.

They are providing a free vegetable garden seminar, April 20, with Christine Cole of Tuitman's Garden Centre as guest speaker. This seminar is open to anyone who is interested in gardening, whether it be within the context of a community garden, or your own backyard.

Several sites are currently under consideration. The ideal setting would be two acres of cleared land, with access to a road or lane


