## Little Theatre prepares for production

Preparations for Georgetown Little Theatre's April production of Noel Coward's *Private Lives* are underway at Stewarttown.

While the actors rehearse, the backstage crew are busy building and painting the set.

Roger Daykin has taken on responsibility for set design for the first time, helped by the construction crew of Ron Hunt, Frank Anthony and Gord Hunt. Daykin has learned his craft through work-

ing on several past productions, most recently *Dr. Cook's Garden*, under the direction of some of GLT's experienced members.

The set for *Private Lives* posed some interesting challenges, both for design and for construction; not only are two complete sets required, but one has to be easily removed after the first act.

Set designs begin with detailed drawings and plans made by the designer in consultation with the

director. Walls, doors, archways, windows, bookcases, fireplaces etc. are then assembled on the floor of the backroom at Stewarttown, painted, and finally baled for assembly on stage.

Performances are scheduled for April 16, 17, 21-24 at the John Elliott Theatre. Friday and Saturday tickets are \$10 while Wednesday and Thursday are \$8. Remember, there is no GST with GLT, so call the Box Office now at 877-3700.
