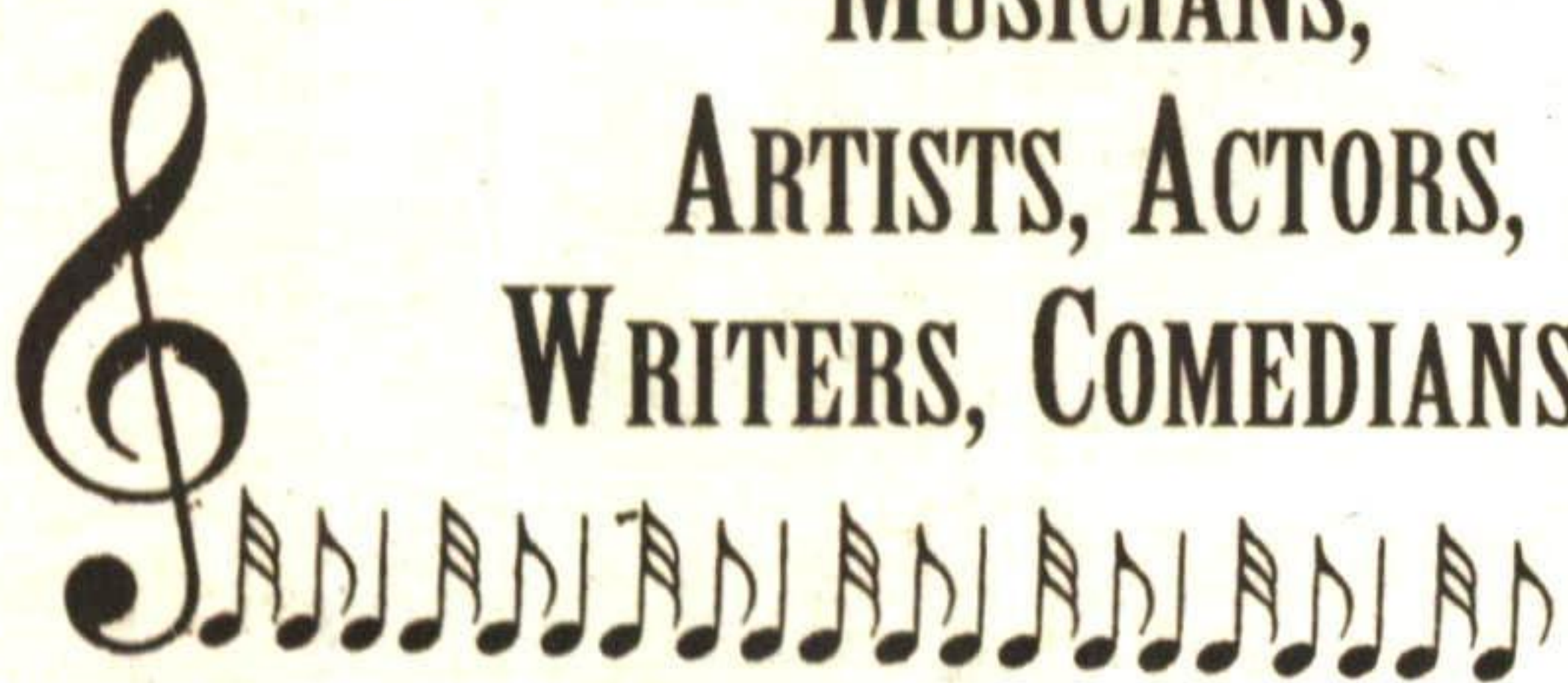

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# TAX TOPICS & TIPS

## QUESTIONS ANSWERS ABOUT YOUR REFUND

Q. Last year I paid \$2,000 in tuition fees for my daughter, who is unmarried. Can I claim these on my tax return?

A. Probably. If your daughter does not need the full amount to reduce her tax payable to zero, she may transfer the unused portion to a parent or grandparent. If she has been claimed as a dependant, she can only transfer it to the person who claimed her. Otherwise she can transfer the unused portion to the parent or grandparent of her choice.

Q. In 1992, I took two one day courses at a local community college. Each cost \$75. I am told that I cannot claim them because tuition fees must be over \$100. Is this correct?

A. No. Because the total tuition fees paid to that particular educational institution were over \$100 you are allowed to claim them.

Q. Do I have to file a tax return to get the child tax benefit?

A. Yes. Your spouse or commonlaw spouse must also file a tax return if you are living together. Revenue Canada needs the information from both returns to calculate the amount of your benefit.

Q. Last year, I paid a lot of medical expenses for my wife. Since she and I both have employment income, should we consider splitting the medical expense claims?

A. Probably not. Because only those medical expenses that exceed 3% of net income (maximum \$1,614) may be claimed, it is almost always beneficial for one spouse to claim all of the expenses incurred for both. The lower income spouse should claim the expenses, providing he or she has sufficient tax payable to absorb the expenses.

Q. I withdrew money from my RRSP in October 1992 to buy a home. I have been told that because of this I cannot make an RRSP contribution to reduce my taxes for 1992. Is this true?

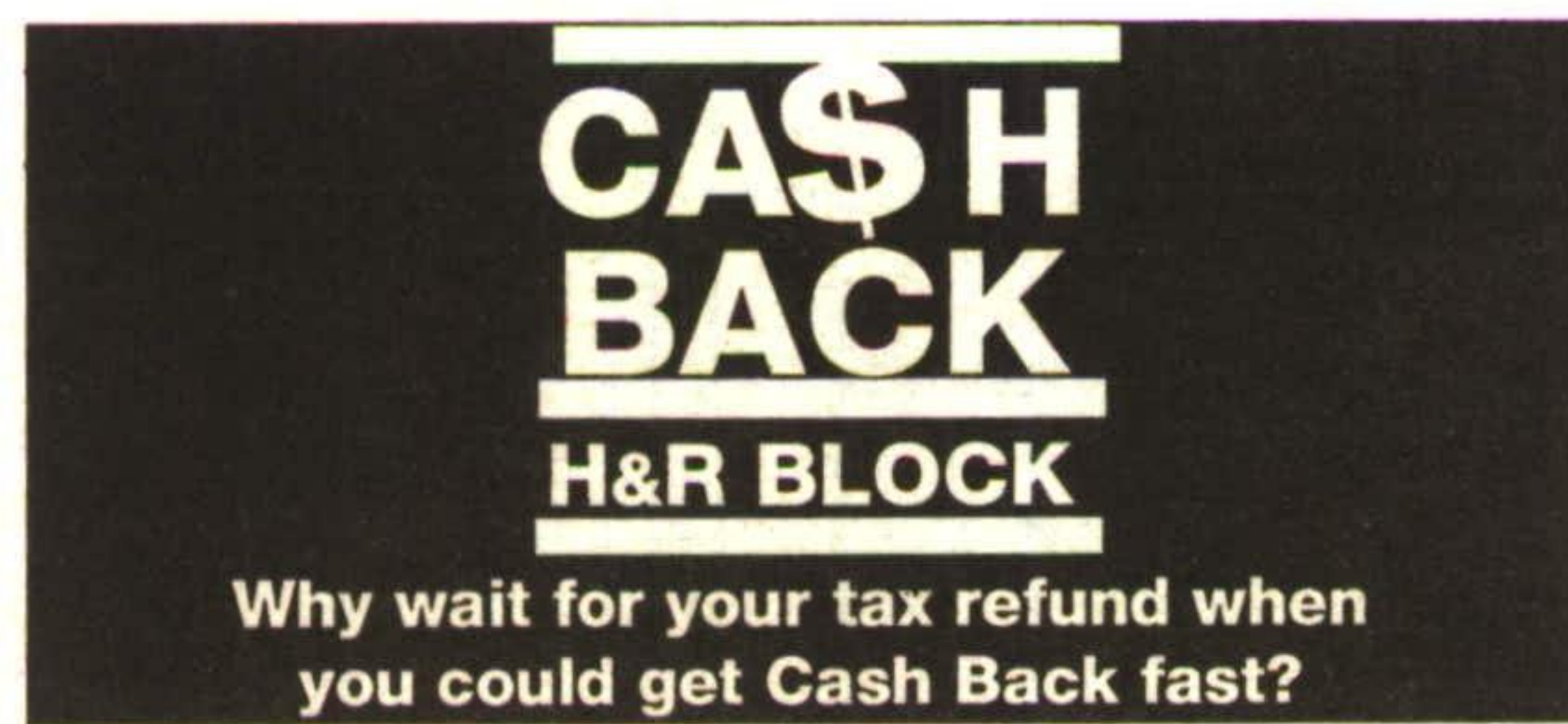
A. In most cases, the answer is "yes", but since the legislation and paperwork is complex, you may need to seek professional assistance if you are in this situation. Essentially, the rules work to prevent anyone who withdrew money from an RRSP under the Home Buyers' Plan from benefiting from an RRSP contribution made during the same period. Any contribution made to your own or a spousal RRSP will have to be included in income on line 129 (up to the amount withdrawn under the Home buyers' Plan) which will offset, in full or in part, the deduction claimed on line 208.
