

Cancer drivers ease the stress

Jenny Tuffin organizes the volunteer drivers for the Canadian Cancer Society in Georgetown, but she doesn't drive herself.

"I couldn't find my way around Toronto. I don't even know how to get around Georgetown," she admits, laughing.

What Tuffin can do is work miracles with schedules, matching cancer patients and their appointments at different hospitals with volunteer drivers until all the pieces in her day book fit together. Tuffin tries to have each driver transport a couple

patients to their appointment and back again. One phone call about a change in appointment recently kept Tuffin on the phone for three hours, reworking everyone for the entire day, she

Tuffin started this volunteer job 10 years ago when she arrived in Georgetown from England and wanted to get involved in the community. She mentioned this to someone and was soon asked to be the convener of the society cancer drivers.

It was all very different when she started. All the patients went to Princess

Margaret Hospital in Toronto for chemotherapy or radium therapy, and Georgetown was smaller then, so there weren't as many patients. Now Tuffin has arranged for patients to be picked up at their door and taken to hospitals as far away as Cambridge. Last week alone she had 11 drivers taking seven patients to and from hospitals each day.

Tuffin has a list of volunteer drivers, and she tries not to send them down to Toronto more than once a week, although some are only available every other week.

"The drivers are great people. I've known them to change their own appointments so that they can drive someone," she says.

about cancer is compounded when they learn they have to get to treatments in Toronto five times a week for five or six weeks. Mary Mann is one patient whose initial fears about this were quelled when she found out about the volunteer

"When I found out (about my treatment) I was panicking with the thought of the traffic, changing lanes and the downtown driving. To be honest, I couldn't have done it it would have been such a strain," Mann says. "I can't say enough about (the service). The drivers are

The transportation centre is where drivers from as far away as Owen Sound often meet the patients. Harris says he likes to pick up a pile of Reader's Digest magazines and read

"They (cancer patients) are very determined people. They're not down, not depressed, but sometimes they're not feeling well on the way back," he says. "For anyone interested in human nature and human experience, being a (cancer) driver is fascinating. It's an inspiration because they (the patients) are determined to come through and it is quite an uplift to be with them."


