Tommy Hunter to perform at 'Birds of Prey' benefit

Well known country singer Tommy Hunter will present a benefit concert in aid of Mountsberg Wildlife Centre's birds of prey rehabilitation centre, June 26.

The 8 p.m. concert, to be performed at Bible Park Church, Burlington, will be the first hometown appearance for Hunter - and his only southern Ontario concert this summer. The two hour show will include the band members who are all familiar to country music fans who have watched The Tommy Hunter Show on television since 1965. Hunter and his wife Shirley have lived in the Burlington area for more than a decade.

Tommy Hunter and his band attracted capacity crowds on a cross-country tour in the summer of 1992. His 1993 schedule includes concerts in locations ranging from northern Ontario to southern Florida.

Tommy Hunter left his home in London, Ontario at age 16, playing with several bands in honky tonks and bars across the country. Three years later, he was performing with Sons of the West, when the group auditioned for a new CBC television show called Country Hoedown.

Hunter became a featured singer on the hit show, which ran for nine years. At the same time, he was hosting the noon network radio show called the Tommy Hunter Show - which led to his own television show in 1965. The Tommy Hunter Show ran for 28 years. It was picked up by The Nashville Network (TNN) in 1982.

Tickets for the show, to be held at Park Bible Church in Burlington on Saturday, June 26 at 8 p.m. are available in advance at Chudleigh's

on Highway 25, and the Milton Chamber of Commerce train station information centre.

Tickets for the benefit concert, with proceeds to aid the \$600,000 Mountsberg Wildlife Centre campaign, are also available by calling (416) 336-1158. Those ordering by telephone may pay by cheque or Visa card. Tickets are \$25 each, and will also provide free family admission to Mountsberg.

Volunteer members of the Halton Region Conservation Foundation have raised almost \$400,000 in less than three years, to build a unique birds of prey rehabilitation centre where about 200 hawks and owls will be treated each year, and to expand the second largest bird banding program in the country. Construction of the rehab centre begins this spring.

The Mountsberg Wildlife Centre is located just south of Highway 401 on the border between Halton and Hamilton-Wentworth, north of Campbellville Road.
