Master plan update

Council members got an update on the status of the town's Recreation and Parks Master Plan slated to be completed this September at the committee meeting April 19.

Jim Morgenstern of the Institute of Environmental Research, a consultant involved in the creation of the plan, said that through public surveys, questionnaires, meetings and interviews, he has found that most Halton Hills residents are happy with the town's existing leisure services.

"The feedback was quite positive," said Morgenstern. "Most feel they have a good service available to them."

He added that the town's recreation brochure is a successful marketing tool because only about one-third of the people surveyed weren't aware of the booklet.

But Morgenstern said adults were not big users of the town's recreation programs, as only about 17 per cent of the adults surveyed were current users, and the majority were children.

"Facilities that were indicated as needed in order were a community centre, indoor pool and arena," said Morgenstern.

He added that a quarter of the Halton Hills residents surveyed felt that supply of parkland in the town was inadequate.

When the Master Plan is completed it should provide recommendations for the town's Recreation and Parks Dept. for the next 10 years and general direction for the next 20 years.

The \$80,000 plan, 75 per cent funded by the province, will include long-term planning recommendations for the town's parklands.

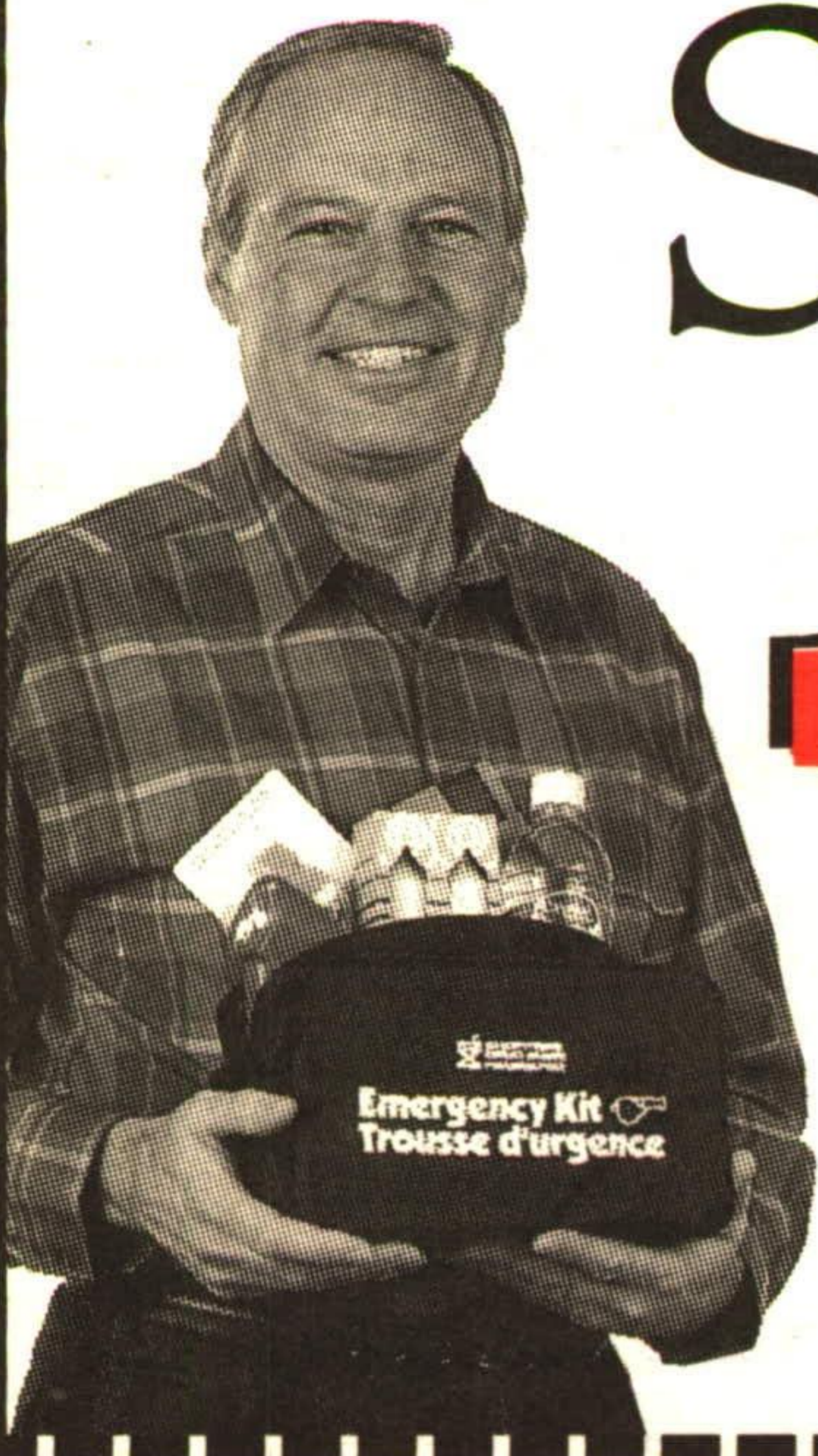
