Man charged

A 63-year-old Georgetown man has been charged with sexual assault, invitation to sexual touching and sexual interference involving an 8-year-old girl. He is to appear in Provincial Court in Milton on May 31. According to Halton Regional Police, the incident occurred on April 17, when the child was visiting the man. Police say the girl told her mother who reported the incident to police.

Garth sign stolen

Someone walked off with a sign saying "Garth for all the right reasons" sometime over the weekend, according to police. The canvas banner was hanging above Garth Turner's Main St. campaign headquarters on the outside wall.

House break-in

A door panel was kicked in and some rooms were ransacked, police said, during a Main St. residence break-in sometime Tuesday afternoon. Police say the thief went upstairs to an office, looked through a filing cabinet and some desk drawers, and took a box of stamps. Some of the stamps were removed and the rest were left by the door. As well, coins and a pearl necklace were taken.

Restaurant break-in

Someone broke into a vacant restaurant on Queen St. in Acton sometime overnight Monday. A crossing guard spotted a smashed window at the former Canadiana Restaurant and told police. Three windows had been smashed as well as a toilet in one of the washrooms, but nothing appeared to be missing, police said.

Sixth Line residents get support of council

Halton Hills town council have tentatively endorsed a water pipe agreement between regional council and approximately 23 residents on Sixth Line and 20 Sideroad.

The proposal asks the homeowners to pay about \$10,000 each to bring piped water to their rural homes and take on the cost of maintaining the pipe over the next 10 years.

The residents have been plagued with serious water problems since about 1988, when the quality and quantity of water began to diminish for an unknown reason, local resident Larry Sisnett told Halton Hills council Monday night.

"It just seemed to have gradually disappeared. It got worse from year to year and different people are affected at different times," he said.

After serious questioning of town staff and the local residents, council voted in favor of the proposal — in spite a Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) report recommending against it. Not only was the NEC afraid of it setting an undesirable precedent, but also believed the move might increase development pressure in rural areas.

"I think we have an obligation to the people that are here, not the

people that might be here some day," Mayor Russ Miller said. "We need to make every effort in the future to ensure that no one else hooks up."

Councillor Gail Rutherford was the only one not to support the proposal.

"Planning-wise it is a poor decision, and yet my heart goes out to people with no water," she said.

Planning director Ian Keith said there is water available to service the area. He also noted that the NEC is only a commenting agency, and has no jurisdiction over the proposed plan. How the residents get their water is a financial matter between the residents and the Region, he said.

All together, it will cost about \$230,000 to bring a six inch water pipe west along 20 Sideroad and 738 metres south along the Sixth Line. The 23 homeowners would set up a corporation to carry out the work in accordance with regional standards. There are a total of 44 lots in the area, and other residents could buy into the water if they have water problems in the future. This would mean everyone else would pay a little less money, resident Tony Harborow said.

Already residents have spent four or five years and about \$15,000 trying to solve their water problems.

Police officer charged with assault

A Halton police officer, assigned to Milton detachment, has been charged with assault after an incident involving another officer last Friday evening.

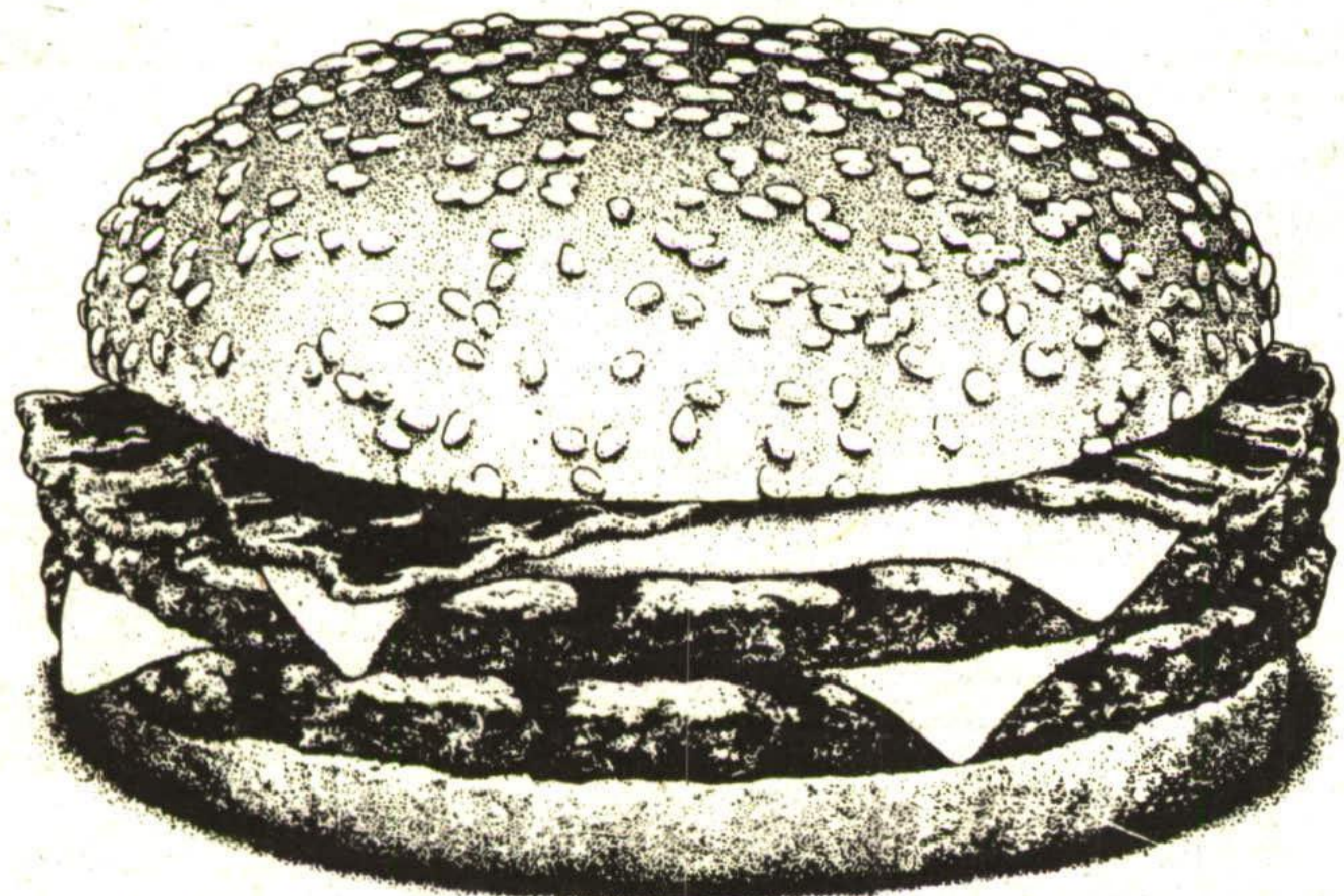
According to Halton Regional Police, two officers were on duty at 7 p.m. when an argument broke out, and although police say there was
