## Former area resident returns to display paintings at JET

Having an exhibition at the Halton Hills Cultural Centre's Gallery feels a little like coming home to St. Catharines artist Brita Stolz Housez.

"It's sort of home still. I always spent a lot of time here," she said in an interview while hanging her paintings.

Housez lived in Terra Cotta for 12 years and is still attached to the congregation at Union Presbyterian Church, she says. Her paintings are on display at the Gallery until June

"I started out doing watercolors but I like the texture of oils. They are not as spontaneous, and I like that," she says. Housez is particularly interested in light and color.

Her last show at the Cultural Centre was three years ago in June 1990, not long after she moved away from Terra Cotta. Since that time, Housez says her painting has become much bolder, and she paints more with a pallet knife, rather than a paint brush.

Housez enjoys painting nature,

and several of the paintings on display are scenes from around her former home in Terra Cotta. When she paints nature, she can take liberties, by adding more branches on a tree or changing the terrain slightly. Housez works primarily from photographs which she takes

"Living in Terra Cotta taught me not to paint outside because there are a lot of bugs and it is a nuisance to flick them off the canvas," she

Housez and her husband Vern, who passed away three years ago, had moved to St. Catharines when he became ill.

"We live on the water (Lake Ontario). I go for walks and gather the pebbles of different sizes from the shore, and I paint them with wildflowers," she said. The rocks will also be for sale at her show. At her last show in Georgetown, she sold all her painted rocks.

"I also paint on glass. I make decorative items like jars and vases which sell for around \$28," she says.

Her paintings sell for \$115 to \$600, and depict scenes of the Maritimes, Ontario and Quebec.
