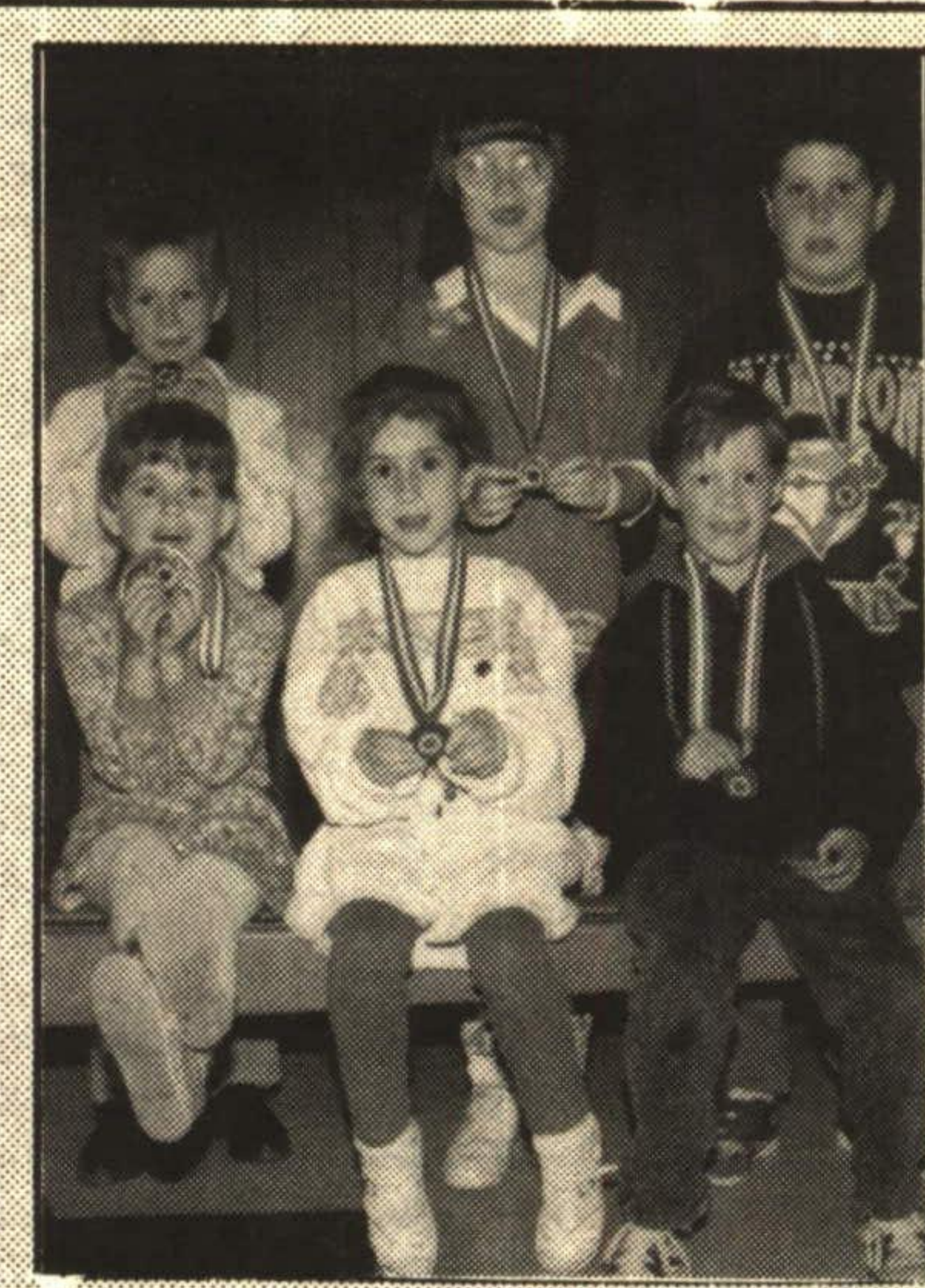
The Acton Rams then traveled to Arthur to challenge another league rival and edged them out with a 7-5 final.

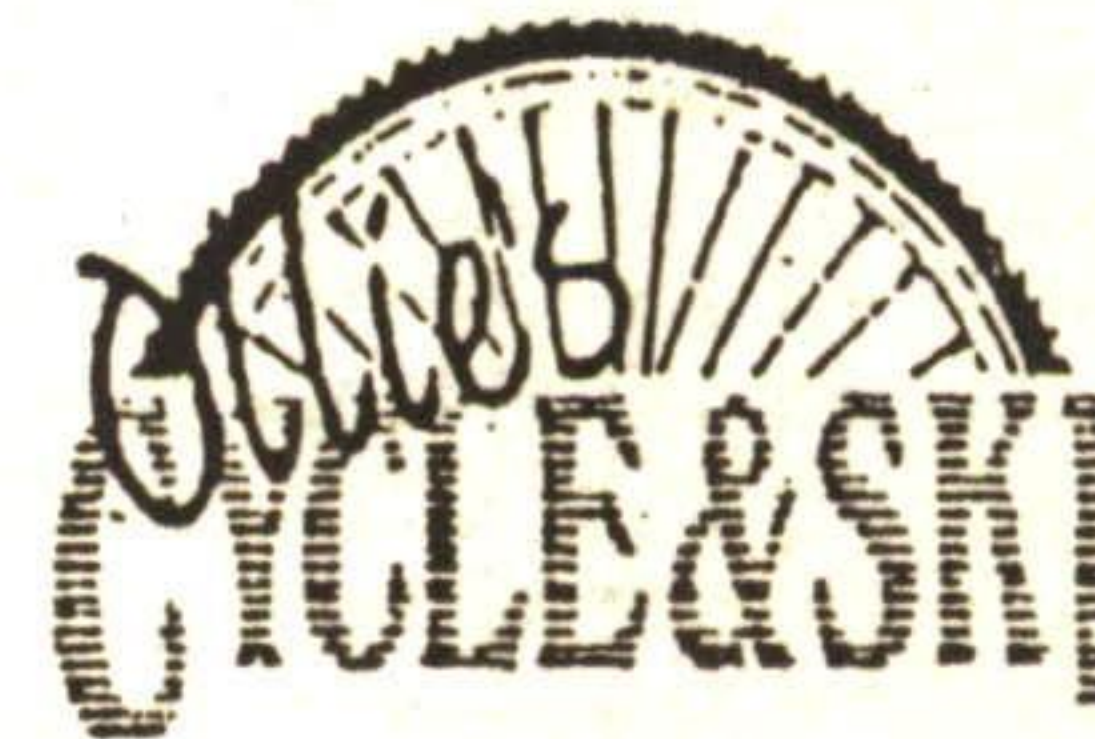

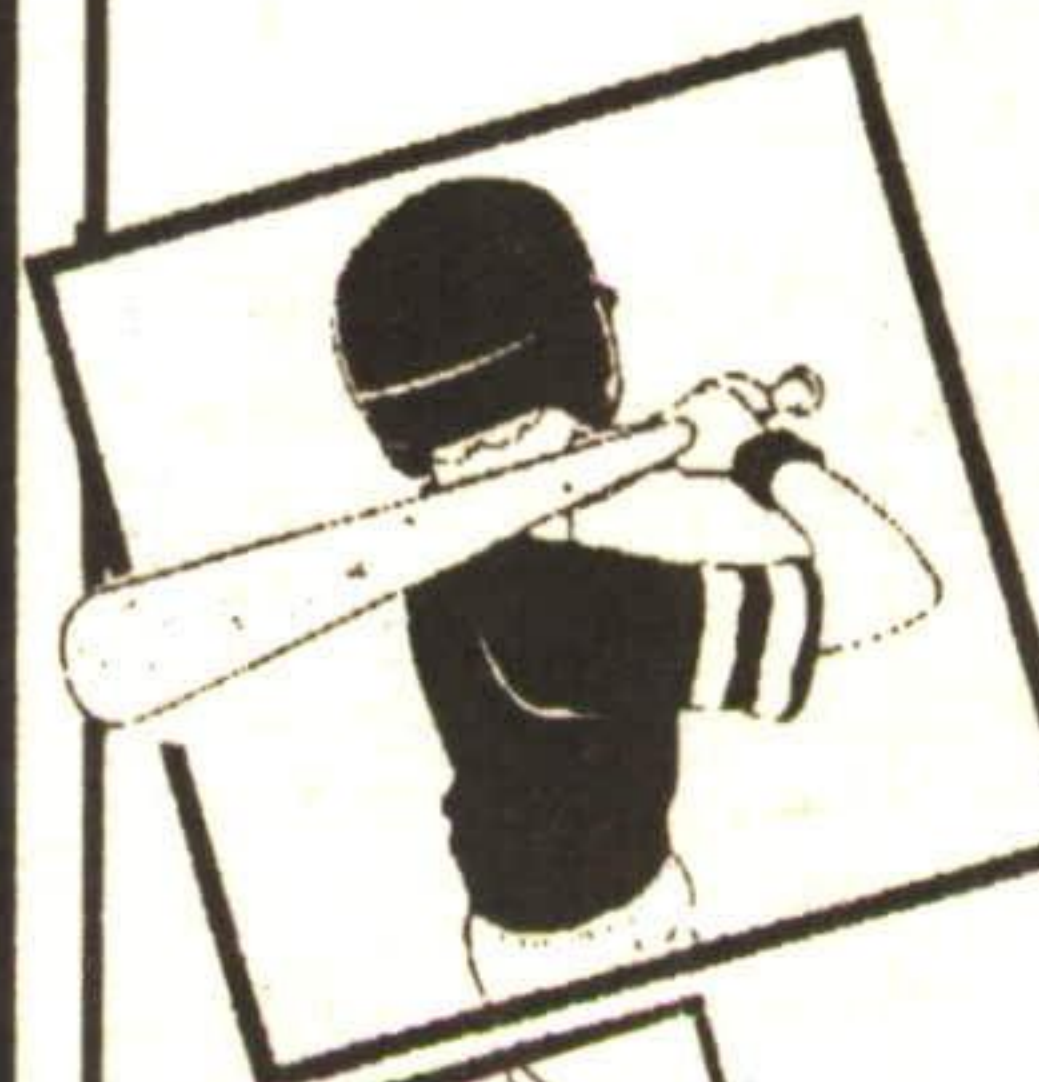
