

## GREEN THUMB GARDENING

### JUNE GARDENING GUIDE

"Spray Delphinium, hollyhock and phlox for mildew, weekly with an appropriate and effective fungicide.

"Prune spring-flowering shrubs once they have finished blooming eg. Lilac, Forsythia, Weigelia, Flowering Almond.

"Avoid using "Sevin" insecticide on fruit trees from flowering period until fruit is the size of a "ping pong ball" or it acts as a fruit thinner (making the small fruit drop off of the tree) in the early stages of fruit development.

"If using chemical dusts, they will stick to the plant better if applied early in the morning when the dew is still on.

"Spring flowering perennials such as rock-rose, creeping phlox and allysum need to have the old seed heads pruned off after flowering.

"This fruits on fruit trees to appropriate spacings.

-- Plums -- leave 6 inches between fruits

-- Apples and Pears -- leave 8 inches between fruits

-- Chemis do not require thinning

"Do not use grass clippings that have a herbicide residue for mulching other plants. But do not apply a mulch thinner than 2 inches to prevent head buildup and bulbs.

"Stake tall and large flowering perennials like delphiniums, peonies, gladiolus and dahlias, lilies.

"Suckers (from root-stock) grow rapidly on grafted ornamentals such as roses, flowering almond, purple leaf sand-cherries, lilacs

-- these should be removed from their point of origin.

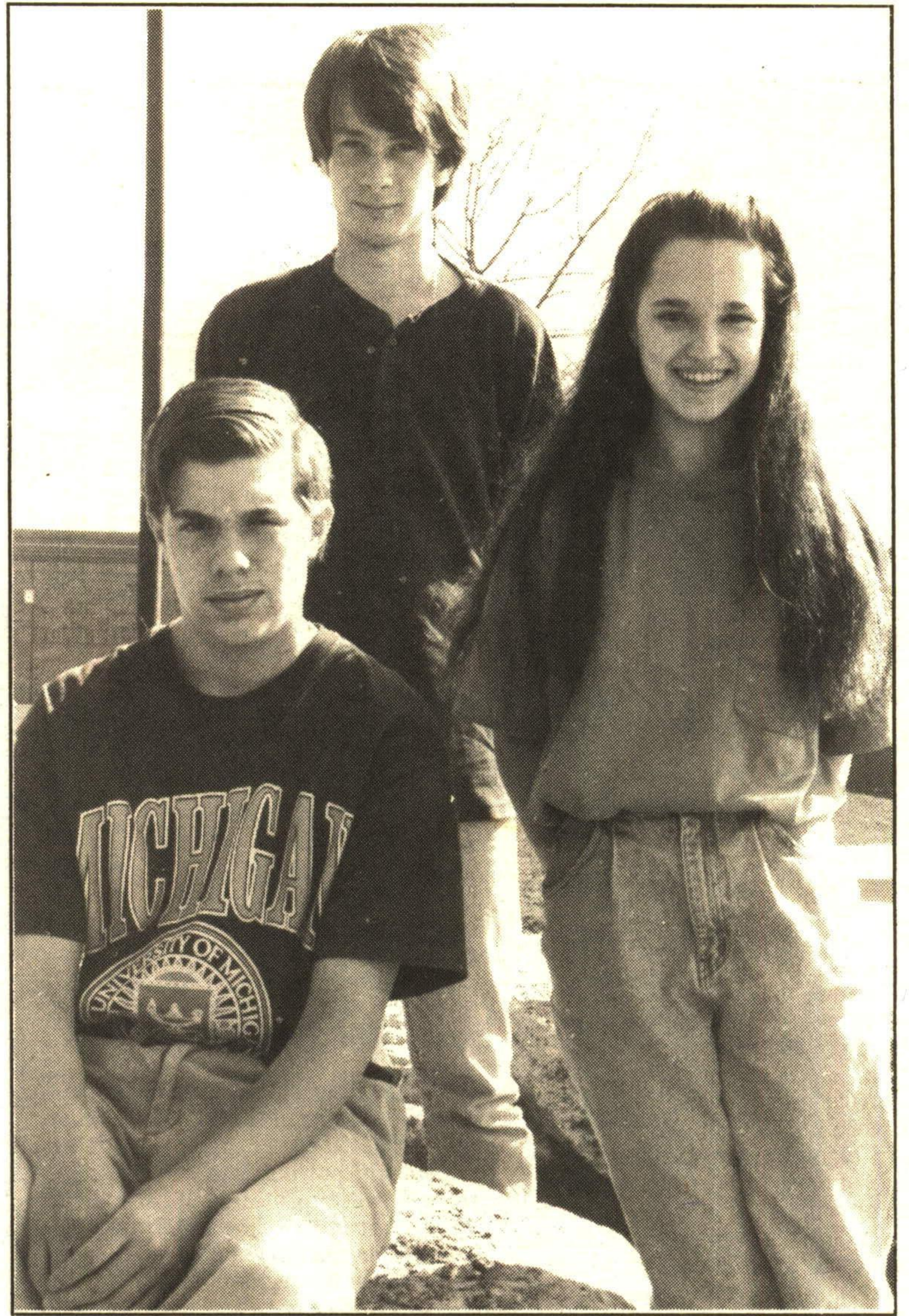
## Acton Legion News
