

Socha new coordinator for recreation programs

With the summer vacation season nearing, the Town of Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department is gearing up for their summer day camp programs

As usual, the Recreation and Parks Department has been working overtime putting the finishing touches on the programs and streamlining things as much as possible for parents, children and leaders. Enrolment numbers are much

the same as previous years, but some programs are filling up.

Greg Socha, a longtime leader with the town summer program has been hired to handle the position of Summer Program coordinator.

Since then, he has taken part in the Leaders in Training program (LIT) the Junior Leaders program and also has served as a leader. Last year he was the supervisor for the sports camps.

Along with acting supervisor of community programs, Joanne Russell, the two have been making a few subtle changes to the programs to ensure all campers have a safe, fun summer.

"We have changed the procedure for the five supervisors this year," says Joanne, "And now they will be stationed in the same venue for the entire summer, so parents and children will find them more accessi-

"We have a super group of leaders," says Joanne. "I'm excited about them starting this year. They are a great group of young people with so much to offer to our programs."

Greg is pleased with the group as well, having worked with many of them over the previous years. A total of 31 staff members are hired this summer, and a few new camps will be offered.

> "We're introducing a new nature camp this summer, which

will be held at Cedarvale," says Greg. "The camp will focus on making the kids environmentally conscious, as well as offering outdoor survival skills like orienteering and map reading."

Most of the programs remain unchanged, and as in the past, an effort has been made to keep as many leaders working in their own community, where they are known.

In an effort to increase the numbers of special needs children integrated into the programs, the summer programs will include an opportunity for volunteers to help out. The Leisure Buddies program is designed to give volunteers a chance to help special needs children, as well as giving the children a chance to enjoy the programs.


