CVCA promotes natural outdoors at Terra Cotta Conservation Area

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority's Terra Cotta Conservation Area had its alcohol ban in effect for the first long weekend of the summer season, May 24.

"We are trying to promote Terra Cotta as a natural outdoor experience," says Ken Owen, manager of Land Resources. "The alcohol ban is an attempt to keep the rowdy parties away from the area and encourage more quiet family camping."

Initial results indicate the alcohol ban to be a success as more than 75 per cent of the campground was filled on the cool weekend with only a couple of minor incidents to report.

"With budget cuts forcing us to close the pool this year, we are going to have to focus on the natural beauty of the area as the attraction," says Owen.
