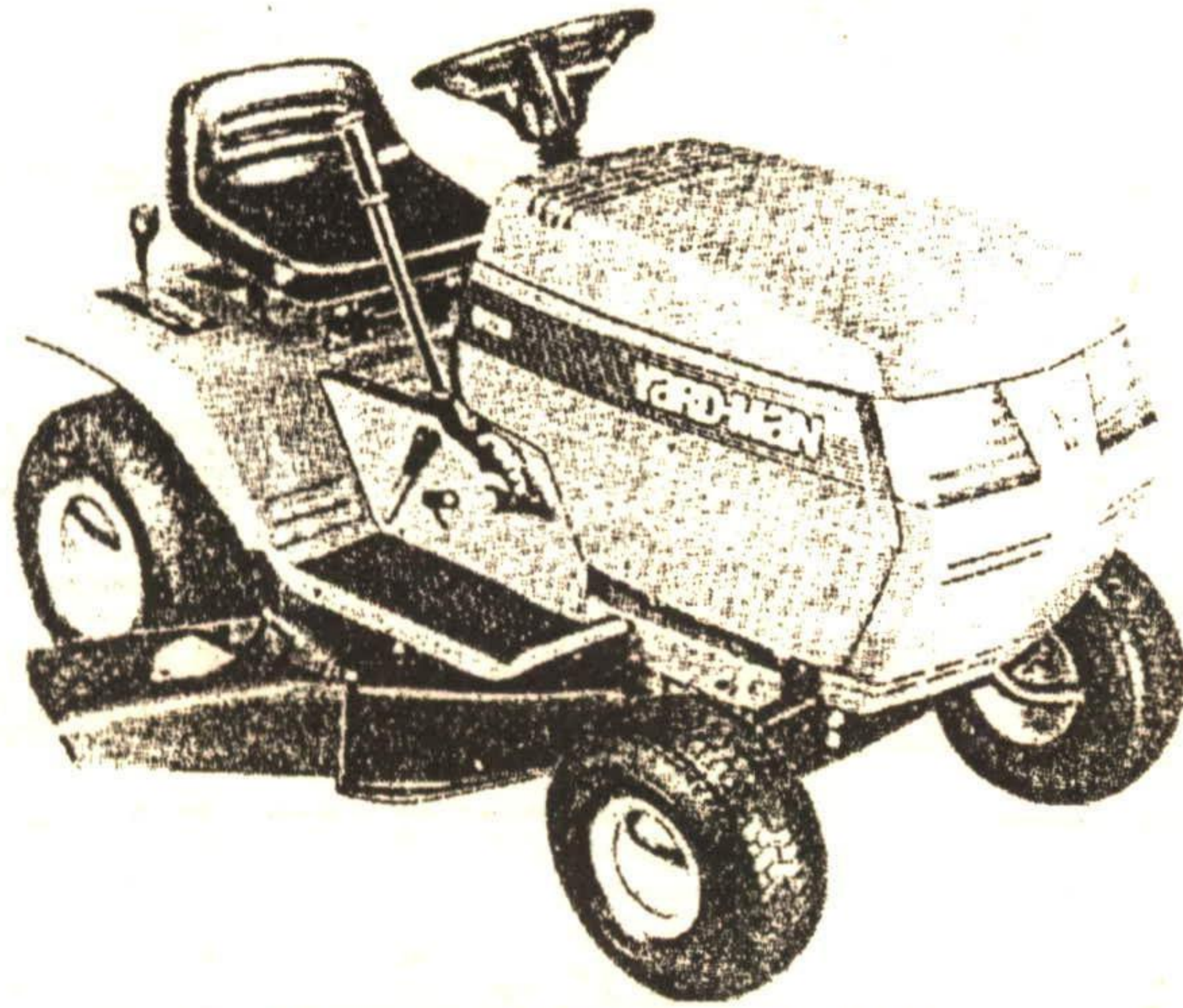

Council defers decision on Metcalfe pond plan

At Monday's committee meeting, council members deferred a decision on the controversial Metcalfe stormwater pond. Instead they requested town engineering staff meet with concerned residents and Ministry of Natural Resources representatives to work out a solution.

Several residents of Metcalfe Court, Regan Cr. and Delrex Blvd. have been up in arms since they heard about the pond proposed to be constructed in the Silver Creek valley. They say the proposed site of the pond is not necessarily the best location, and that a proper study should be done to determine if it is.

At Monday's committee meeting town engineering staff recommended council support going to the design stage of a downsized stormwater pond.

Ward 4 councillor Ron Chatten made the deferral motion because he said town staff didn't do what was asked of them at a recent meeting.

"In our recommendation (councillor's Chatten and Al Cook) we

wanted a meeting to be set up with the appropriate parties, MNR representatives, residents and our staff," said Chatten. "We wanted them to sit down, problem solve and come to a decision."

Concerned citizen Bob Evans told committee members the residents were not invited to work with town staff on the issue since the last meeting, nor were they contacted by staff so they could be told of their recommendation.

Evans said they awaited word from staff, but finally had to contact them last week.

Ernie Bodnar of Milran Development, who was required by the MNR to construct the pond in conjunction with the second phase of its subdivision in Georgetown south, told council members he would be willing to do whatever council requested. But, he just wants to get on with building the second phase of the development.

Bodnar requested staff devise a clause in the subdivision agreement which would allow him to get on with the second phase, while they worked out the details of stormwater management.
