**Pedestrian hospitalized**

A 68-year-old woman is in satisfactory condition at Milton Hospital after she was struck by a wheel which came off of a U-Haul trailer on Friday, June 11. The trailer was being pulled by a car going westbound on 10 Sideroad near the Third Line. When it crossed over some railway tracks, the right wheel of the trailer fell off, police said. The wheel rolled 77 feet and struck the woman, who was out walking her dog. The driver of the trailer administered first aid while the passenger called an ambulance.

**Motorcyclist injured**

A motorcyclist was thrown from his bike and taken by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital following an accident Wednesday. The Glen Williams resident was riding east on Guelph St. in the curb lane at 7:30 p.m. when a 1985 Chevrolet driven by a Georgetown resident turned onto Guelph St. from Armstrong Ave., and collided with the motorcycle, police said. The driver of the car was charged with making an improper lane change.

**Stereo stolen**

An Alpine stereo and a citizen band radio were taken from a car parked overnight in the underground parking lot at 26 Park Ave. in Georgetown. The car was locked and the passenger window was broken in order to remove the stereo. The roof lining of the car was also damaged. The value of the stolen goods is \$500, police said.

**Local councillors want heat put on Fisheries**

Acton regional councillor Rick Bonnette plans to get Halton Peel MP Garth Turner to put some pressure on the Department of Fisheries and Oceans to get moving and work with Halton Region on formulating a fair compensation agreement so more water can be taken from Fairy Lake for development.

Bonnette said he and councillors Marilyn Serjeantson and Norm Elliott plan to meet with Turner early next week.

"We have to emphasize the need to get this resolved before the OMB hearing (to begin June 28)," said Bonnette. "If this isn't resolved there is a chance everyone (the developers) is going to walk away from the hearing."

The hearing will look at the issue of Acton boundaries, the direction and amount of growth in the town, and which developers will get servicing allocations and when.

Bonnette said without the commitment for water, there will be no development in Acton.

"In light of recent events that would be like a death knell for the town of Acton," said Bonnette.

The agreement is required because the Department of Fisheries and Oceans and the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) are concerned about the effects on marine life, particularly brook trout, and water quality in Black Creek and Fairy Lake if more water is taken from Prospect Park well.

Benson Leung, manager of special studies with Halton Region, says Region staff plan to meet with

representatives from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans and Ministry of Natural Resources Monday to work out the details of the agreement.

Leung, who added region staff haven't even received formal word yet from the federal government that such an agreement is an option, is hopeful the Department of Fisheries doesn't rely on just the Fisheries Act for the agreement.

"That is a very strong document. It has a lot of teeth to it. In certain parts of the country where it is necessary, but I believe there are ways to formulate a fair agreement," said Leung.

He added under the act any person who takes part in destroying fish habitat, could face a \$300,000 fine for the first offense and another fine and up to six months in jail for subsequent offenses.

"I don't know all the details but that could mean the officers and director of an organization, such as the CAO of the region, or members of council."

Bonnette said if that's the case, the agreement won't likely receive regional council approval.

Another agreement has to be struck with the MOE, which will lay out the parameters for monitoring groundwater levels, quantity and quality and the performance of the sewage treatment plant.

A meeting has been set for June 24 to work out the details of that agreement.

Leung said if all goes smoothly, both agreements, would not likely be signed until at least the end of August. But, Leung said the OMB hearing should proceed because he's optimistic an agreement will be reached.
