Schaljo said in his judgment the judge agreed the town had followed the stipulations of the tax sales act.

"The judge relied on another statute, the Courts of Justice Act, which I feel shouldn't have been applied."

That act allows the court to decide whether or not it wants to avoid forfeiting money to the municipality.

At the hearing in April Schaljo said he presented the judge with two precedent setting cases in which a judge determined the Courts of Justice Act shouldn't apply to municipal tax sales.


"I do not understand how the judge got around that. The precedents, which were similar cases,

Schaljo said it could take six months to two years for the appeal to be heard by a panel of three

Schaljo said he is optimistic the panel will rule in the town's favor.

In the meantime the money will continue to be held by the courts,



New Sacre Coeur School aims for Sept. 7 opening

Despite the fact the road hasn't been built and services aren't available yet for the new Coeur School in Georgetown, the Halton Roman Catholic School Board is shooting for a September 7 opening.

"We should have the school building done in time for the first day of school," said Giacomo Corbacio, controller of building and plants for the Roman Catholic School Board. "We are optimistic Miller Dr. and sewer services will be ready by early August."

Toby Barwick, of Halton Hills Village Homes, which is developing the land in Georgetown south, said construction of Miller Dr. will begin in a matter of days. Barwick said with a little luck and cooperation by the weather the road should be completed in mid-August, in time for the school's fall opening.

"We have had delays in finalizing contracts with servicing contractors and waiting for a public meeting (to be put on by the town). We were expecting it back in April,"said Barwick.

"But we can no longer wait for the town," he added. Barwick said they are going to go ahead with the road construction under a pre-servicing agreement.

Henry Tse, director of building code and bylaw enforcement for the town, said when water, sanitary and hydro servicing is in place, and Miller Dr. is completed the town will issue the school board an occupancy permit and staff and students can move into the school.

Corbacio says if they can't make the Sept. 7th deadline, the students will remain at the present Sacre Coeur school site, and make the move to the new school when it's ready.

"We can move in a weekend," said Corbacio.

The school board is calling the new school a "state of the art facility" in the arts, sciences and technological studies.
