Bruce Reed, president of the Credit Valley Coalition, says those attending an Interim Waste Authority (IWA) meeting in Huttonville last week were disappointed they didn't release weighting and ranking criteria for landfill site selection.

"They were to give us the weighting and ranking criteria," said Reed. "But when we persisted they said weighting and ranking won't be released until the landfill sites are announced."

That announcement is expected

in late August.

Reed said the more than 100 people who showed up at the meeting were expecting to find out which criteria the IWA considered most important when selecting a site.

"We don't know what they deem to be important; we would assume that the environment would be the highest."

Robert Dormer, IWA program adviser for Peel who was at the meeting, said they had no plans to release the weighting and ranking information because the IWA is still receiving input from the public on what criteria should be considered

when selecting a site.

"The criteria is still not final-

ized," said Dormer. Dormer says the IWA plans to finalize the criteria about a month before the preferred landfill sites are announced.

How that criteria is weighted and ranked will be announced about the same time the sites are announced.


Reed sees that as unfair to citizens and the various community groups opposed to the proposed landfill sites.

Dormer says a group in Metro York Region opposed to sites there has echoed Reed's sentiments, and the IWA is reviewing whether or not it will release the weighting and ranking of criteria before the preferred sites are announced.

Dormer is not certain when a decision would be made in that regard.

Reed said in the meantime the Credit Valley Coalition and other groups opposed to the landfill sites selected in the Greater Toronto Area have hired a consultant to look at the environmental safety of the landfills.

The consultant's report should be submitted to the IWA by the August 7th deadline.
