\$18,000-worth of golf supplies stolen from Blue Springs

More than \$18,000 worth of golf wear, balls, and books was stolen during a burglary at the Blue Springs Golf and Country Club in Acton last April. Halton Police and Crime Stoppers would appreciate hearing from anyone with informa-

The man was held for a bail hearing and charged with robbery.



Charges withdrawn

An assault charge against an acting Halton police sergeant has been withdrawn. The police sergeant was charged in connection with a verbal confrontation between two on-duty police officers at Milton's 12 Division station April 30. Police conducted an investigation after a complaint from a constable. The crown attorney in the case told Milton provincial court June 30 the charge was being withdrawn due to "insufficient evidence." However, the 15year veteran of the service faced informal internal discipline under the Police Services Act in connection with the complaint.
