

## Into the Woods opens Tuesday

The upcoming Georgetown Globe production of *Into the Woods* boasts a supportive and experienced production team.

Among the team members are set designer Jacky Willows, stage manager Tom Callaghan, and co-producers Barry Pletch and Evan Robinson.

Jacky Willows has 11 years of involvement with community theatre behind her. She has worked with Georgetown Globe and Georgetown Little Theatre.

Globe audiences will recall her most recent achievement in set design of last spring's production of *The Mikado*, in which Jacky's creative use of colorful, picturesque Japanese screens wowed all who attended. Jacky also designed the set for Globe's 1992 fall production of *Oliver*.

Jacky has also lent her design talent to GLT in productions of *Best*

of Friends and *An Act of the Imagination*. Jacky received a THEA nomination for best set design of *The Curate Shakespeare: As You Like It*, which utilized a variety of geometric shapes and vivid colors. In addition to Jacky's set design contributions, she has also performed on stage and directed for GLT.

*Into the Woods* brings a newcomer to Globe in the role of stage manager. Tom Callaghan, a resident of Brampton, has worked with a number of groups over the past eight years, both community and professional. Included are Brampton Musical Society, Canadian Spectrum of Mississauga, Calbes Voice Studio, Mississauga City Centre Opera Company, and Toronto's Co-Opera.

Tom has stage managed or assisted in stage management for a variety of productions including *The Merry Widow*, *Kismet*, *The King and I*, *The Fantastiks*, *The Miracle Worker*, and *Fiddler on the Roof*, to name a few.

Tom first became interested in community theatre largely because of his wife, Brigida, who enjoys performing.

"Because this hobby takes up so much of her time, this was the only way I could see her sometimes."

Basically, the stage manager is responsible for the flow of the show in the theatre from start to finish, and this particular show is a very busy one.

"I saw a video of *Into the Woods* about two years ago and said if any of the groups do this I'd really like to stage manage. What a challenge!"

Co-producers Barry Pletch and Evan Robinson are relatively new to their responsibilities.

Barry produced Globe's first summer production *Grease* in 1992. A lot rides on the producer's shoulders, and Barry appreciates the "shared responsibility" of co-producer.

Barry has also performed in many Globe productions including the roles of Danny in *Grease*, Noah Claypole in *Oliver*, and Commander Harbison in *South Pacific*.

*Into the Woods* marks Evan Robinson's production team debut as co-producer. He is enjoying this new challenge as he has a hand in ensuring that all the pieces come together. There is, however, a great deal of pressure and appreciation for the support of another co-production, especially for his first time.

Evan would like to try producing on his own and is also interested to learn more about the technical side of a production to round out his theatre experience.

He has also performed in Globe production of *My Fair Lady*, *South Pacific*, *Grease*, and *The Mikado*.

*Into the Woods* promises to be a sound technical accomplishment as well as an artistic treat!

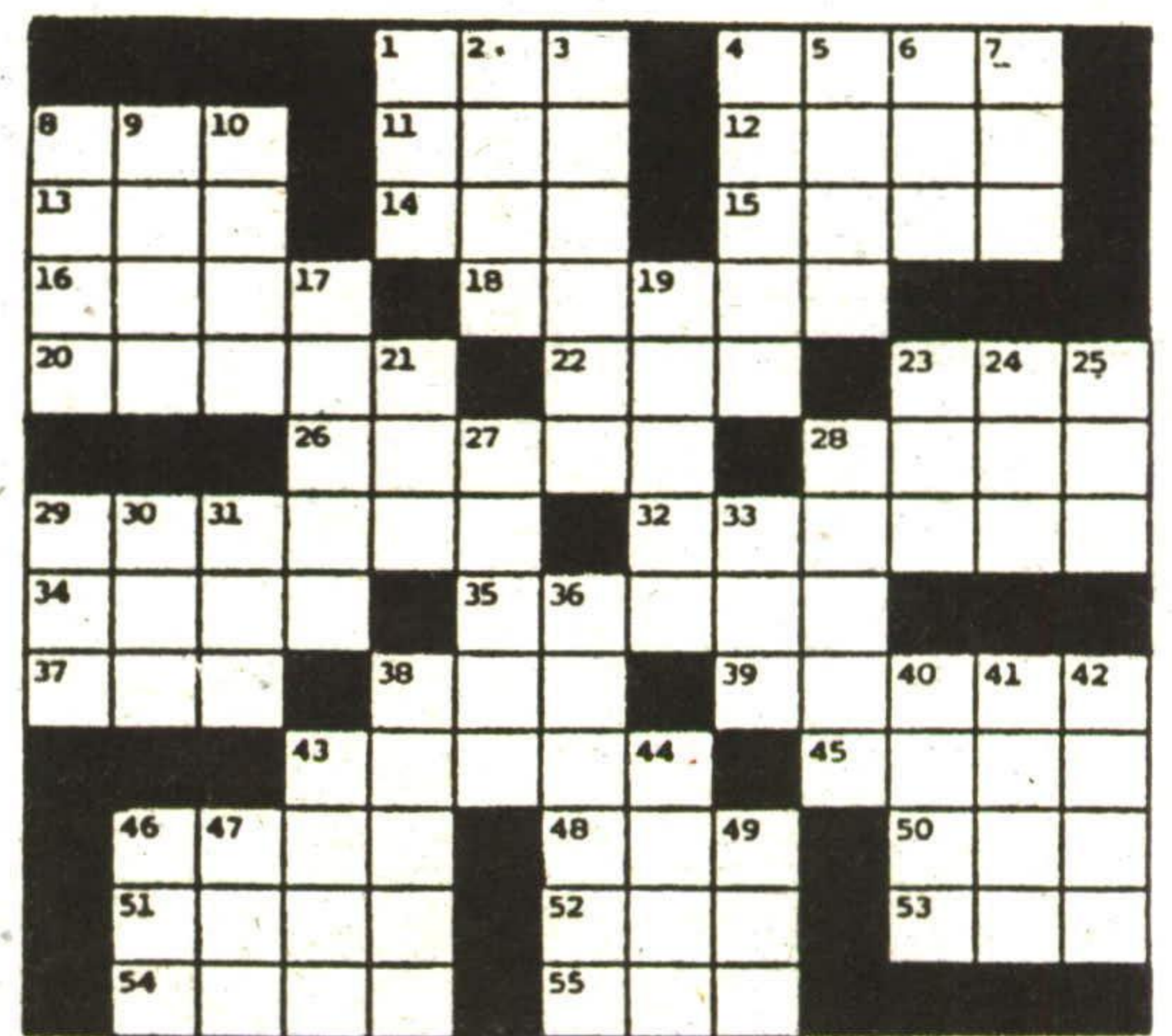
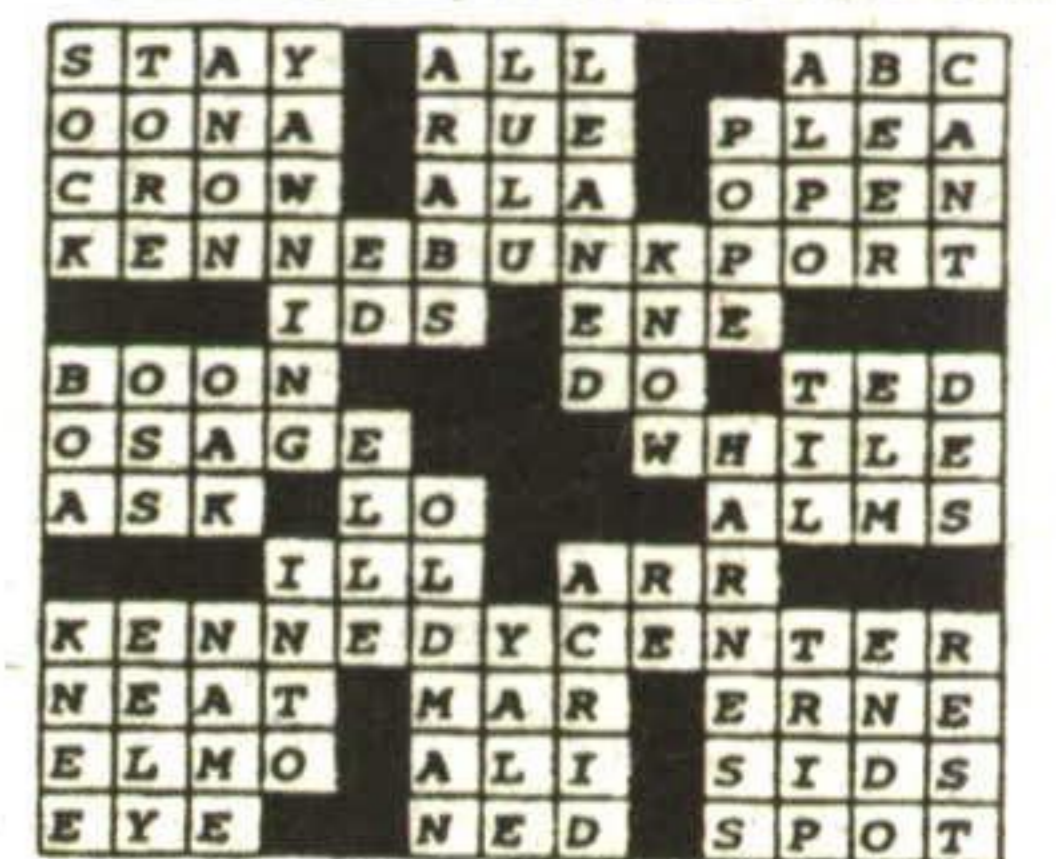
