Jacky received a THEA nomination for best set design of The Curate Shakespeare: As You Like It, which utilitized a variety of geometric shapes and vivid colors. In addition to Jacky's set design contributions, she has also performed on stage and directed for GLT.

Into the Woods brings a newcomer to Globe in the role of stage manager. Tom Callaghan, a resident of Brampton, has worked with a number of groups over the past eight years, both community and professional. Included are Brampton Society, Canadian Musical Spectrum of Mississauga, Calbes Voice Studio, Mississauga City Centre Opera Company, and Toronto's Co-Opera.

Tom has stage managed or assisted in stage management for a variety of productions including The Merry Widow, Kismet, The King and I, The Fantastiks, The Miracle Worker, and Fiddler on the Roof, to name a few.

Tom first became interested in community theatre largely because of his wife, Brigida, who enjoys performing.

Basically, the stage manager is responsible for the flow of the show in the theatre from start to finish, and this particular show is a very busy one.

There is, however, a great deal of pressure and appreciates the support of another co-production, especially for his first time.

Evan would like to try producing on his own and is also interested to learn more about the technical side of a production to round out his theatre experience.

He has also performed in Globe production of My Fair Lady, South Pacific, Grease, and The Mikado.

Into the Woods promises to be a sound technical accomplishment as well as an artistic treat!
