Ontario's bountiful corn harvest will be celebrated at the Ontario Agricultural Museum during the 12th annual Corn Festival, Sunday August 22.


A 1920 Sawyer-Massey steam engine will be fired up to cook the corn while still in the husk to seal in the freshly picked flavor.
