CLEANING YOUR DENTURES

Keeping your dentures clean is the most important patient responsibility in good oral health. Dentures, like natural teeth, attract plaque, become stained, and collect food particles that can cause bad breath. The two best methods of cleansing dentures are brushing and soaking.

SOAKING

Soaking your dentures every night with an effervescent tablet will effectively cleanse away food particles from crevices and spaces between the teeth. It will remove plaque and odor-causing film, and eliminate virtually all micro-organisms.

BRUSHING

The most effective cleansing method is brushing with a special denture brush and paste. Use a special denture paste, as regular toothpastes may be too abrasive, and can damage the acrylic surface of your dentures. Brushing daily will maintain the bright natural appearance, as well as leaving your mouth feeling fresh. Brushing is particularly recommended for removal of plaque. The best cleansing method is to combine both brushing and soaking.

Denture Therapists can clean your dentures professionally, for stubborn stains and build up.

Councillors distribute servicing

Halton Hills council endorsed a recommendation that would distribute servicing capacity from unused industrial designations into residential capacity, at a recent council meeting.

That capacity is then to be distributed on a proportionate share basis to all residential developments endorsed by council.

Prior to the vote Alan Heisey, the lawyer for Bond Arch, and Gord Petch representing Coscan, attempted to get council to defer their decision until the Ontario Municipal Board hearing got word from the Ministry of Environment and Energy on how much servicing capacity would actually be available in Acton.

Heisey also stressed it wasn't fair all the residential developments got a proportionate share.

"It is not appropriate to treat different properties the same," said Heisey. "I can't see how properties in Acton East that have been designated for 11 years should be considered the same as those designated in June 1993."

Heisey added "we are playing with numbers and we don't even know what the numbers are yet."

Petch said the town would be stuck with a useless document if the MOEE only allowed for 1,200 more persons.

The document supported by council is based on the full development of the town to 10,000 people.





Students say sayonara




