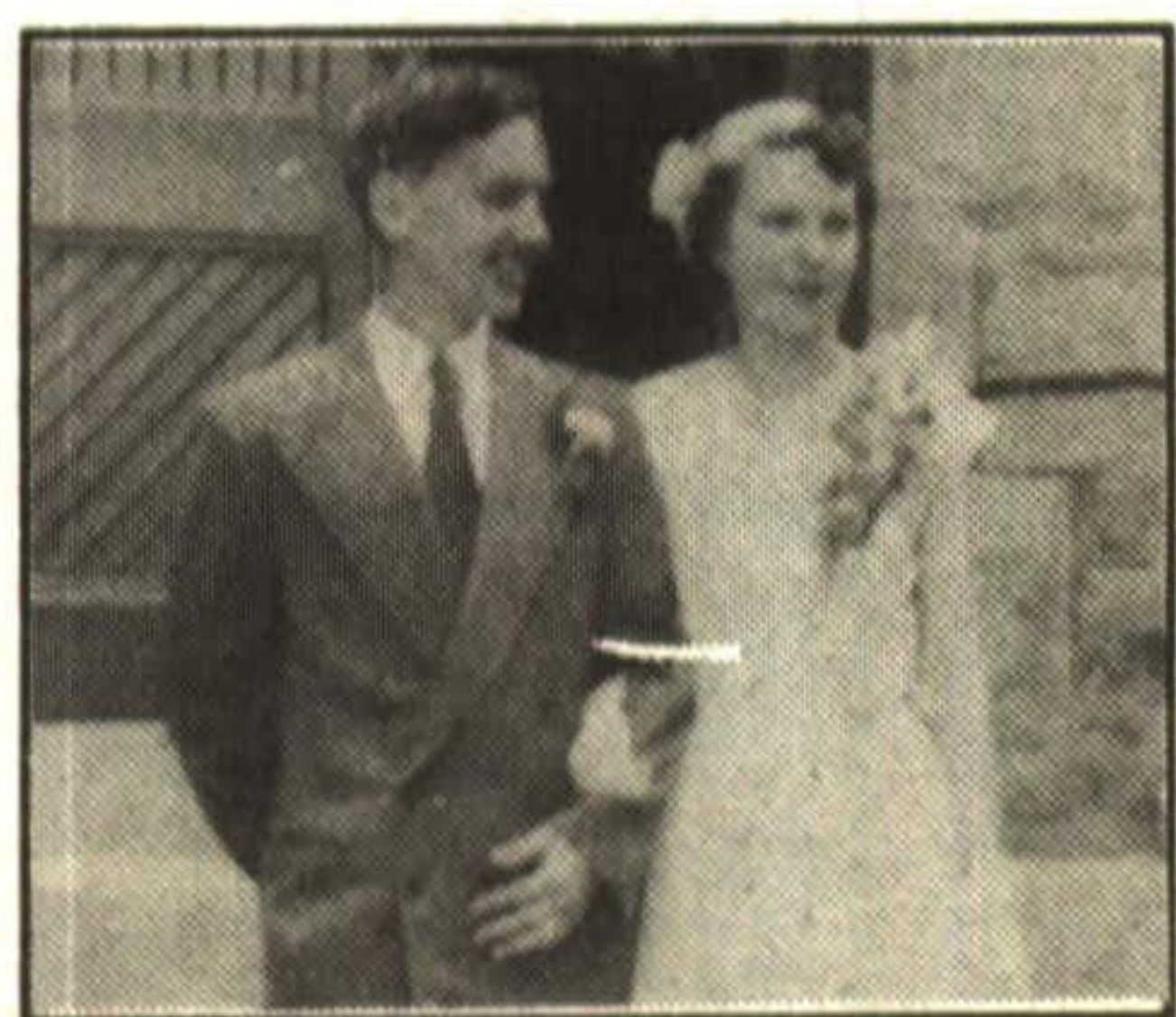

Camera Club calls for 'Capture the Hills' entries

All local shutterbugs should be gearing up for the third annual Capture the Hills photo competition, September 26, sponsored by Halton Hills Camera Club.

The rules remain much the same as previous years. All participants must preregister and will pick up their 24 exposure roll of film any time after 5 a.m. the day of the competition at Halton Camera Exchange at 130 Guelph St., Georgetown.

Entrants then go out and shoot the entire roll within the geographic boundaries of Halton Hills, then return it to Halton Camera

Exchange before 10 p.m. that evening.

The prints will be available for pickup at Halton Camera Exchange Oct. 1 or 2, and participants can then select a number of prints to be entered into the judging, in the three categories.

When the entries are returned, they will be judged in their respective categories, and the awards presentation will be held Oct. 25 at the



Civic Centre, at which time all photos entered will be on display.

The categories have changed slightly since last year. The first is Landscape and Architecture, the

second category is Plants and Flowers while People, Creatures and Critters makes up the third.

As in previous years, Konica Film is a main sponsor and will be

providing many of the prizes.

The contest is open to anyone, but the shooting must be done within Halton Hills.

Previous winners have had their photos published on the cover of the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department brochure as well as other publications.

Cost of the entry is \$25, and the camera club hopes to attract 100 photographers this year.
