Election signs are popping up through Halton Hills like mushrooms after a summer rain and the candidates have already jumped on the campaign trail in Halton-Peel, hopeful of victory in the October 25 federal election.

So far Halton-Peel has four declared candidates: Garth Turner will carry the Progressive Conservative hopes, Julian Reed for the Liberals, Dick MacDuffee for the Reform Party, and Hilliard Cox for the Libertarian Party. A candidate for the New Democratic Party has been selected, but the name has not yet been released by riding president Sean Usher.

Two all-candidates meetings have already been set for Sept. 23 in Acton at McKenzie Smith School and on Sept. 30 in Georgetown at Sacre Coeur Hall.

Fire calls down

Halton Hills firefighters responded to 47 calls for service during the month of July, Halton Hills town council learned Tuesday evening during the fire department's submission of the Monthly Fire Services Report.

While local firefighters received nine fewer calls during July of 1992, estimated damage in July was \$16,600, as compared to \$73,500 in July 1991.

Three Halton Hills firefighters received minor injuries in July and there were no public injuries. A total of six rescues were made during the month.

Counterfeit bill

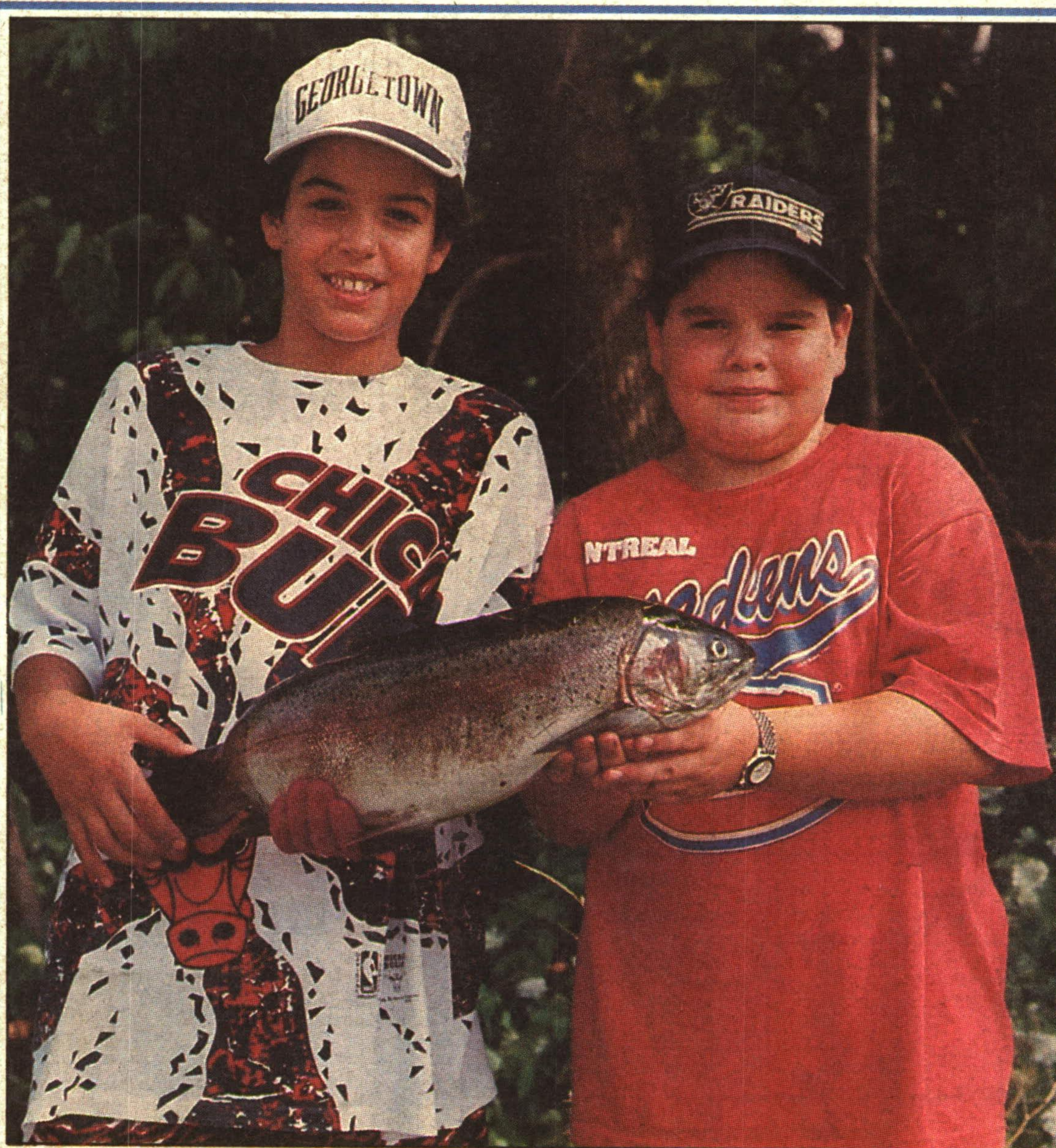
A \$100-bill received by a Georgetown hair stylist was false, according to Halton regional police. The bill was taken in sometime between August 30 and September 4.

Police warn of con artist

Police are warning store owners and employees of a con artist who has approached employees three times in the past month in Georgetown.

According to police, a man will enter the store, tell the employee that he is a personal friend of the owner and asks for some money, between \$30 and \$100 as a loan. He says his car is being repaired and he doesn't have enough to pay the bill, but will leave his keys as collateral. The suspect says the owner, who he calls by his or her first name, would give him the money.

On August 20, a part-time employee at Jeannette's Deli gave the man \$30, on September 2, the suspect made off with \$50 from CueFhoria Billiards. Also on September 2, the suspect asked for \$100 from Up, Up and Away, but was not successful in getting any money.

The man has been described as white, with black hair which is short on top and curly and shoulder length at the back, has brown eyes and a mole under his left eye. Police believe the incidents are related.
