NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT SEPTEMBER 13, 1993

As a requirement under Ontario's *Environmental Assessment Act* the Regional Municipality of Halton hereby notifies all interested individuals and parties that the Environmental Study Report (ESR) for the above-mentioned project has been completed.

Subject to the comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of other approvals as necessary, the Regional Municipality of Halton may proceed with the design and construction of the project.

This study recommends that Mountainview Road be improved to a four-lane cross-section, with two lanes in each direction. Additional turning lanes and intersection channelization improvements will be required at the entrance to the Waste Water Treatment Plant, Barber Drive, Argyll Road and Regional Road No. 10. Sidewalks and a 3m boulevard which includes provision for a bicycle path will be provided on each side of the road.

The roadway crossing of the Silver Creek Valley proposes a 6% roadway gradient and construction of a 106m, four span structure with approximately 6m vertical clearance, to span Silver Creek and accommodate storm flows. This structure will also allow passage through the Valley by both animals and pedestrians. A rock fill embankment up to 13m high will be constructed in the Valley on each side of the structure and on the south side of the Valley the roadway will be lowered by up to 5m. Additional property acquisition may be required after detail design for the slope requirements associated with the lowering of the roadway on the southwest side of the Valley. Property may also be required for the Mountainview Road and Regional Road 10 intersection improvements. These recommendations are identical to those presented at the Public Information Centre on December 15, 1992.

The Environmental Study Report documenting this Class EA is now available for review. Copies of this document have been placed in the Town of Halton Hills Clerk's Office (1 Halton Hills Drive), the Halton Hills Public Library (9 Church Street) and the Halton Regional Centre at 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville for your convenience.

There is a 30-day review period for this ESR beginning September 13, 1993 and ending October 13, 1993. Your comments should be forwarded in writing on or before October 13, 1993.

If concerns arise regarding this study which cannot be resolved in discussion with the Region, a person/party may request that the Minister of the Environment and Energy "bump-up" the project to an individual environmental assessment. This request must be received by the Minister before the end of the 30-day review period.

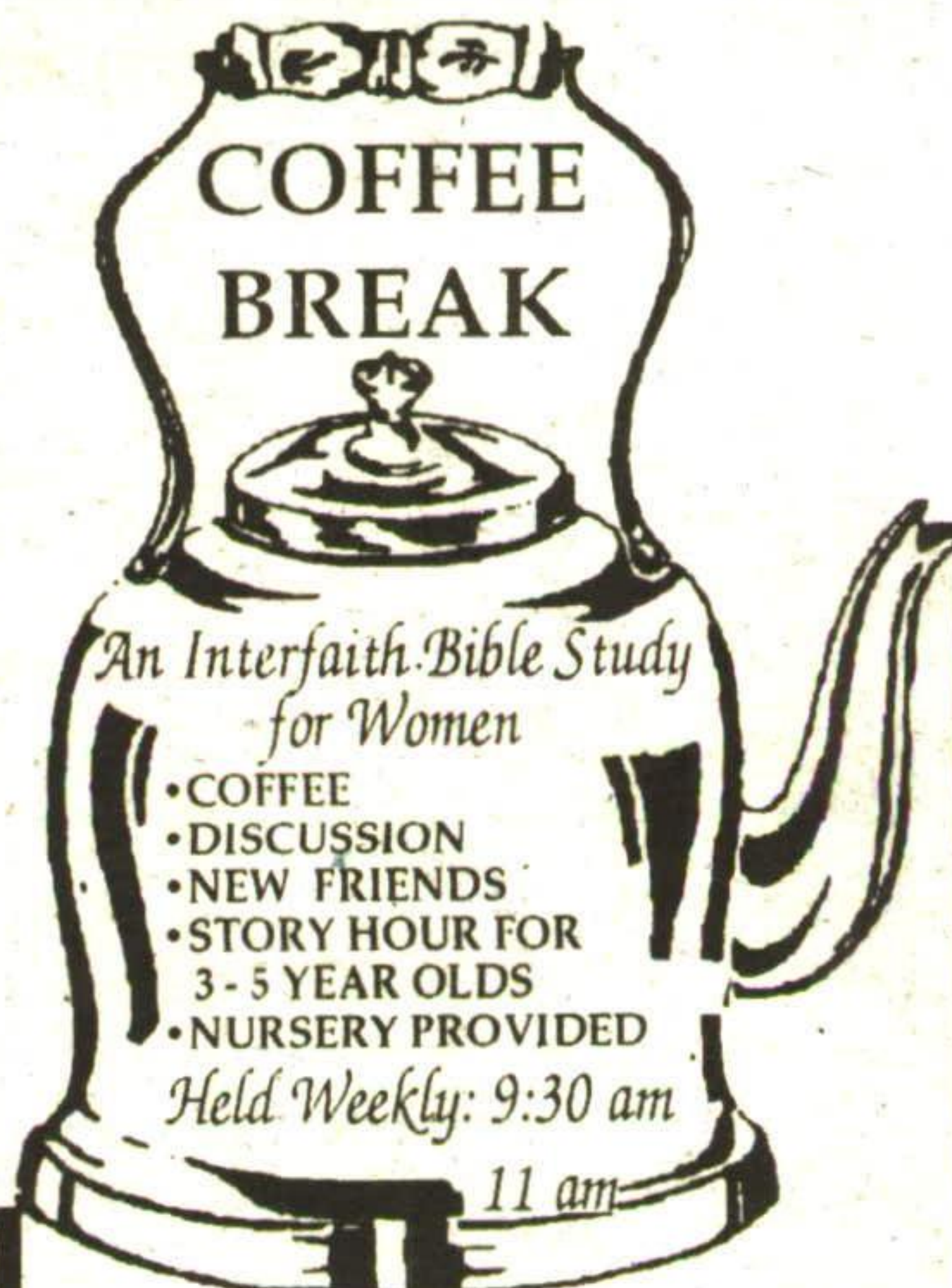
