CLEANING YOUR DENTURES

Keeping your dentures clean is the most important patient responsibility in good oral health. Dentures, like natural teeth, attract plaque, become stained, and collect food particles that can cause bad breath. The two best methods of cleansing dentures are brushing and soaking.

BRUSHING

The most effective cleansing method is brushing with a special denture brush and paste. Use a special denture paste, as regular toothpastes may be too abrasive, and can damage the acrylic surface of your dentures. Brushing daily will maintain the bright natural appearance, as well as leaving your mouth feeling fresh. Brushing is particularly recommended for removal of plaque. Metro could be 'Historic' event

Trainer Bill Robinson's top freshman colt, Expensive Scooter, is a race away from cashing in on the richest payday of his rookie season but Robert Grand's ace colt, Historic, could come between Scooter and the winner's circle.

These two colts were winners in their respective \$40,000 Metro eliminations at Mohawk Raceway in Campbellville last Saturday and will undoubtedly loom as favourites in this Saturday's \$534,200 Metro, Canada's richest stakes event for two-year olds.

Expensive Scooter, a Direct Scooter colt, scored his eighth win in 12 starts in the first eliminiation with a time of 1:55.

Earned a Start

The win increased his bankroll to \$220,632, but more importantly earned him a starting position and a good post placement (two) in next week's final.

Scooter paced three wide past the half to take control enroute to his two and a half length victory.

"He's turned into a real professional," praised driver Jack Moiseyev. "He's a perfect gentleman and he's matured into a raceHook Beat

horse."

The top four finishers from each of the two eliminations plus one fifth place finisher advance to the Metro final.

Louisiana, Viking Terror and Sweet Dragon all qualified from the first elimination.

Historic tied the Metor Stakes record with a 1:54, four and a half length victory over Million to One and Armbro Miracle in the second elimination.

Doug Brown guided the Nihilator colt, a full brother to Breeder's Digger champion Almahurst, to his sixth win in nine starts. Historic now has \$113,431 in purse earnings. The complete field for Saturday's \$534,200 Metro Stakes final is as follows: Metro, Expensive Scooter, Million to One, Armbro Miracle, Viking Terror, Water Tower, Sweet Dragon, Almahurst Gold, Louisiana.

Brush should be bundled and tied in lengths no greater than 1.2 meters (4 feet) and should not exceed if an 1.3 cm (1/2 inch) in diameter.
