Calling all Georgetown residents new 905 are code begins Monday

Beginning Monday, Halton Hills residents with 416 area codes, and others living outside of Metropolitan Toronto, will have a brand new area code.

The code will be 905.

The area code split was required by Bell due to the swelling Golden Horseshoe population and an increase in the number of cellular telephones, fax machines and computer modems, numbers in the 416 area code are running out.

The other area codes, including 519 will remain unchanged. Other communities making the switch to the new code include Oakville, Burlington, Milton, Brampton and

Mississauga. The new code will circle Metropolitian Toronto and span to Niagara on the Lake, North York and Cobourg.

The new area code will not affect calling charges.

"Calls which you can make today without incurring long distance charges will remain toll-free after the changeover," said Jim Rivett, project manager with Bell Canada.

The new area code will not mean a big change for Halton Hills residents.

Acton residents will still be able to make local calls to Georgetown by dialing seven digits. Halton Hills residents will still be able to call Acton without dialing the area


After the switch instead of dialing 1-416 and the number when calling Oakville or Mississauga, Georgetown and Acton residents will have to dial 1-905 and the number. To call Toronto, Halton Hills residents will dial 1-416 and the number, as they have in the past.

Bell will allow a four month grace period to give people a chance to get used to the new code. Callers who continue to use the old code when dialing will be connected until March 25, 1994. After that date misdialed calls will reach a recording instructing callers dial using the correct area code.

Which day is Halloween?


