GREEN THUMB GARDENING

FALL GARDEN GUIDE

*Do not prune any shrubs or trees. This may encourage new growth that will not have sufficient time to harden off (resulting in increased susceptibility to winter injury).

*Any evergreens that you want to transplant should be done by mid-October. Deciduous trees and shrubs should not be transplanted until their foliage has dropped and they are dormant.

*This is an ideal time of year to transplant or divide overgrown perennials. Perennials that have died in the middle should be dug up, the centre cut out and the remaining parts split up and replanted.

*Spring flowering bulbs such as crocus, daffodils, tulips, etc. should be planted in the fall. If rodents dig your bulbs up sprinkle a little Bloodmeal on the soil or plant the bulbs a little deeper.

*To have forced bulbs blooming early in the New Year, pot them up now and chill them for 10-12 weeks.

*Summer flowering bulbs such as Dahlia, Gladiolus, Tuberous Begonia and Canna Lily are not winter hardy. Once the foliage is killed by frost, dig them up, shake off excess soil, dry them for a few days, then pack in peat moss and store in a cool, dry location for the winter (such as basement).

*Vegetables such as parsnips taste better if left in the garden until they have received a few heavy frosts. Brocolli, brussel sprouts and other brassicas are immune to frost and will continue to grow late into the fall.
