

RCMP officer injured in shooting incident

Halton police aren't releasing many details about an RCMP officer who shot himself in the leg in Milton.

The officer, John Dimitroff, 32, was off duty and on his way to work at 7:15 a.m. He had a complaint

about another driver and asked an OPP officer to investigate, Halton Regional Police Inspector Les Graham said. The OPP officer pulled the driver over and Dimitroff also stopped his car.

It was at this time that he dis-

charged his revolver while seated in his own personal vehicle, Graham said.

Dimitroff was transported to Milton District Hospital where he is being treated for a gunshot wound to his leg. The wound is not life

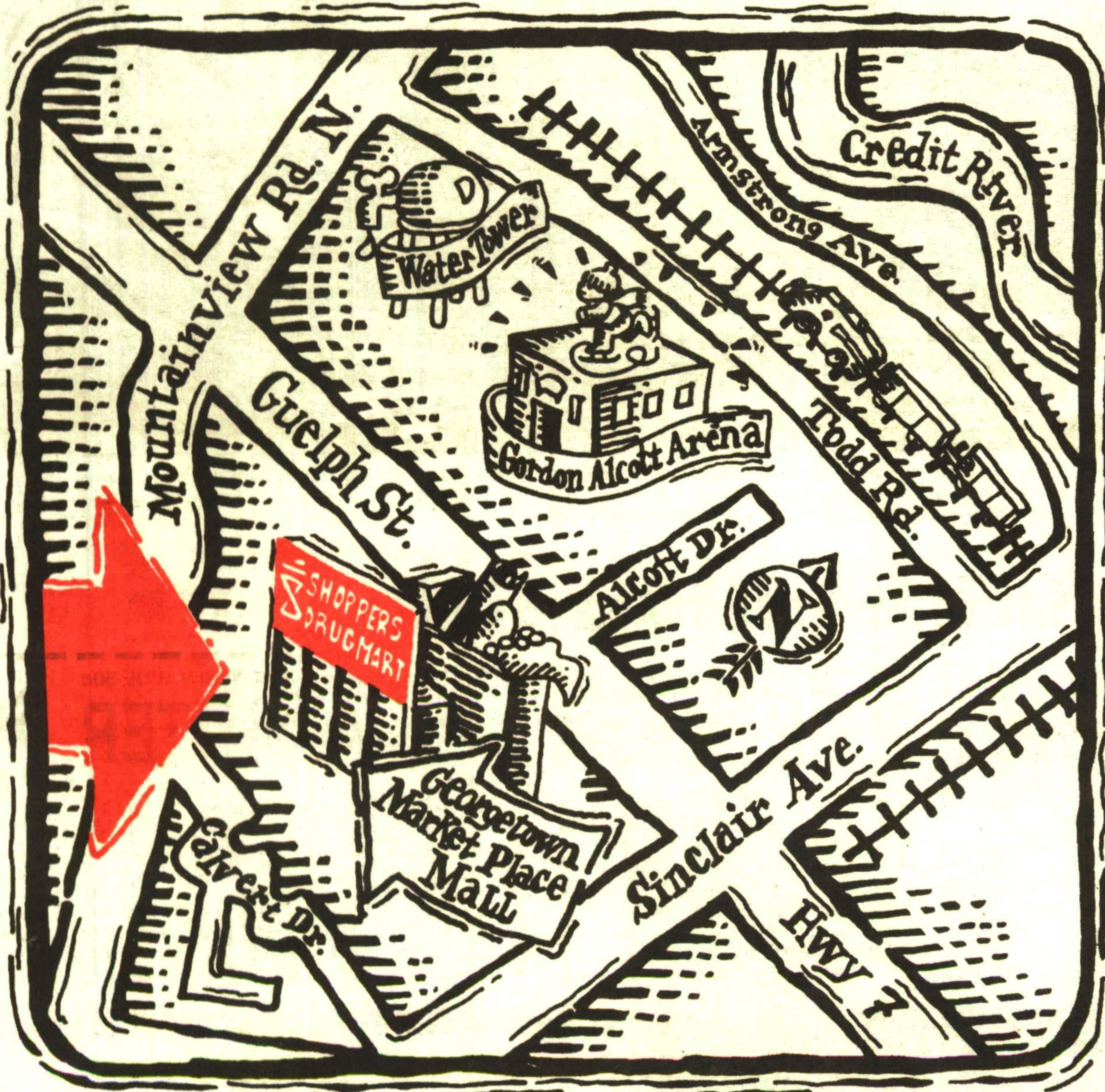
threatening.

The occurrence is under investigation by the Halton Regional Police, major crime unit.

Graham said they don't yet know why Dimitroff drew his service revolver.

Man arrested

A Brampton man was arrested Wednesday and charged with break and enter. According to police, the break-in took place Monday at Daddy's Chicken on Guelph St. in Georgetown. While nothing was taken, about \$6,000 worth of restaurant equipment, including tables and chairs, was stacked up ready to be removed from the building, police said. The restaurant had to be closed for a few days following the incident.

Windows broken

Equipment stolen

Police have a suspect in the theft of a Macintosh computer and a 26-inch television overnight Sunday, they said. The equipment, worth \$2,350, was taken from a Georgetown recreational club.

Three arrested

Three people were arrested Thursday and charged with two counts each of theft under \$1,000. The three are from the Hamilton area and were employed by a cleaning company which cleaned Zellers in the mornings, said Det. Don Cousens. According to Cousens, store security detected that merchandise had been going missing and discovered that some clothing and various other items were being taken out of the store. Store security reported the incidents to police Wednesday and the arrests were made Thursday. The three are to appear in Milton Provincial Court on Nov. 22.

Student charged

It took three teachers to hold down a student who was charged with assaulting another student at McKenzie Smith School in Acton on October 19, police said. The arrest was made on Tuesday.
