

Entrepreneur program offers mentors and help

A new program for budding entrepreneurs who have lost their jobs has started up in Georgetown.

The Entrepreneur Centre is at the Indoor Mall and several information sessions have been held already. The last one, and last chance for people to participate in the program which begins November 8, will be held Tuesday morning.

The program is five days a week, seven hours a day for 20 weeks. During the first 10 weeks the 20 participants who have been selected to join the class, will work on their business plan. For the following 10 weeks they can use the computer lab and resource centre at the Indoor Mall like their own office to develop their plan and do further research.

The program is funded by the Canada Employment Centre, while the Halton Board of Education has the contract to carry out the program. They are also working with the business community of Georgetown, whose members will teach some sessions and act as mentors to the new entrepreneurs.

Program coordinator Deborah Dennison said entrepreneurship is in her blood.

"My grandfather invented a

game in his basement using my grandmother's ironing board," she said. Back in the 1930s, he went to Sears with his idea for a table top hockey game which has since become a classic game. Dennison said she has had numerous businesses, including restaurants and even a dating service. She has been working with the Halton Board of Education for the past five years.

"I love start up," she said. There are three other people working with her on the program with expertise in computers, consulting, training and marketing.

Four information sessions of two hours have been held, and the last is Tuesday from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Participants in the program have to have attended an information session in order to go through an extensive selection process. They must also either be collecting unemployment insurance or severance in order to participate in it. People participating in the program are eligible to collect unemployment insurance for up to a year. This is one of the changes made to the Unemployment Insurance Act which came into effect last spring.

Dennison said this is the pilot program, and she hopes it will be held twice a year in the future.
