On Friday, October 22 the team made the long trek to Barrie for a very tight game decided in the final frame.

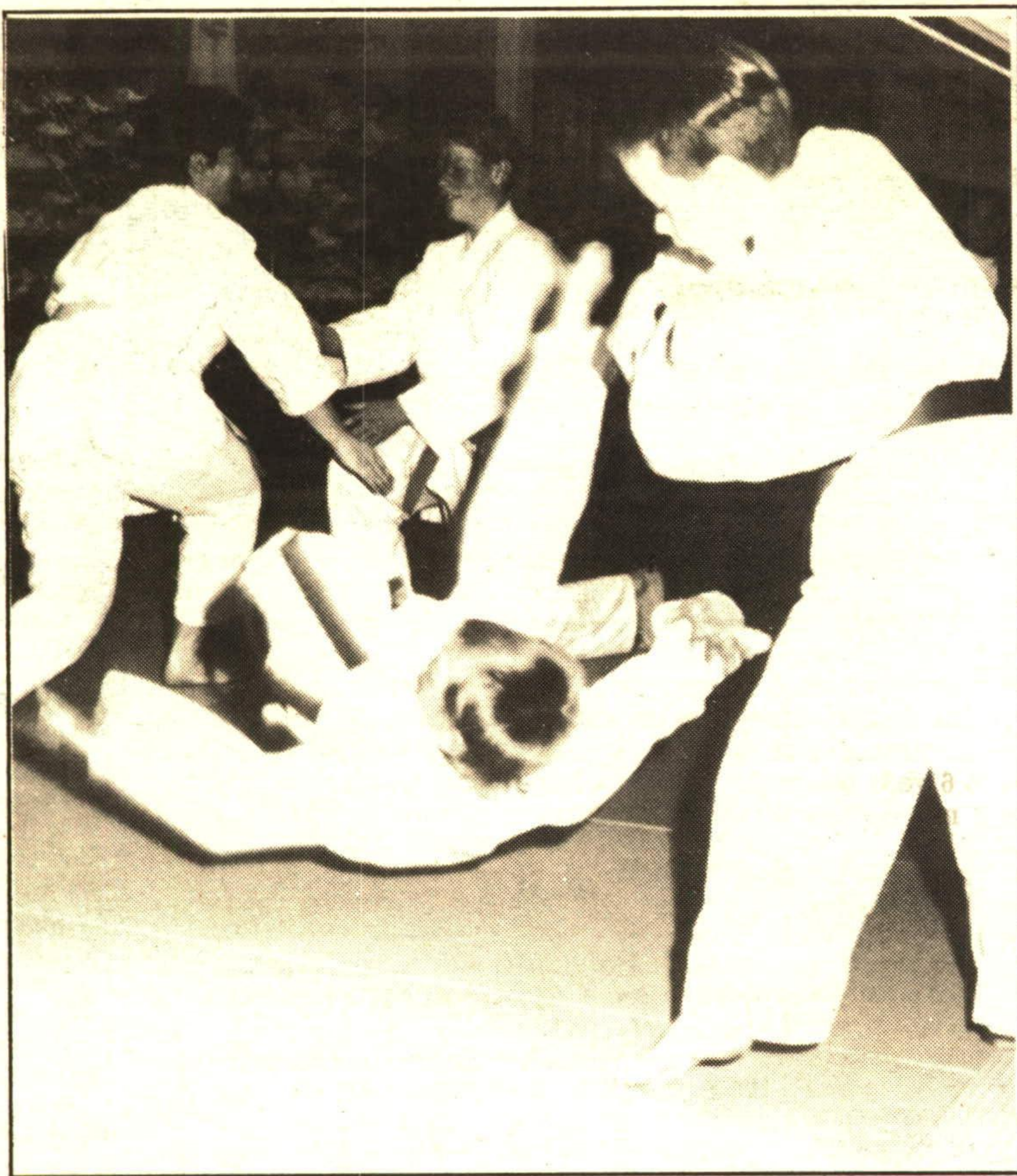

Hardie Hanover ties world mark

There wasn't much question as to what horse would win the \$84,000 Robert Stewart Pacing Stakes for freshman fillies at Mohawk Raceway Sunday night, but speed was another issue.

The race produced a duplicate of the 1:53.3 world record time for freshman fillies on a five-eighths mile oval. The sensational Hardie Hanover, one of North American's top freshman fillies, guided by Tim Twaddle, was responsible for the amazing performance and according to Twaddle could have broken the record.

Ambro Monsoon with Mike Saftic aboard left like rocket to clock a sizzling 26.3 opening panel before Hardie Hanover took command of a nine horse field in front

of the stand for the first time.

Hardie clocked a 55.3 half and 1:23.1 three quarter length victory over Easy Winter. Singin' For Supper took show money.

It was the eighth win in 13 starts for the Big Towner filly, who is owned by trainer John Burns, Martwest Racing Stable, Keith Waples and John Ferguson.

The win bumped her season bank account to \$228,284. "She was pretty confident on the lane," said Twaddle. "I had to encourage her once." According to Twaddle, the horse's greatest asset is her versatility. "She's just so handy. She can sit a hole, leave, do anything."

Hardie has a couple of races left on her schedule before hanging up her hopples for the season.
