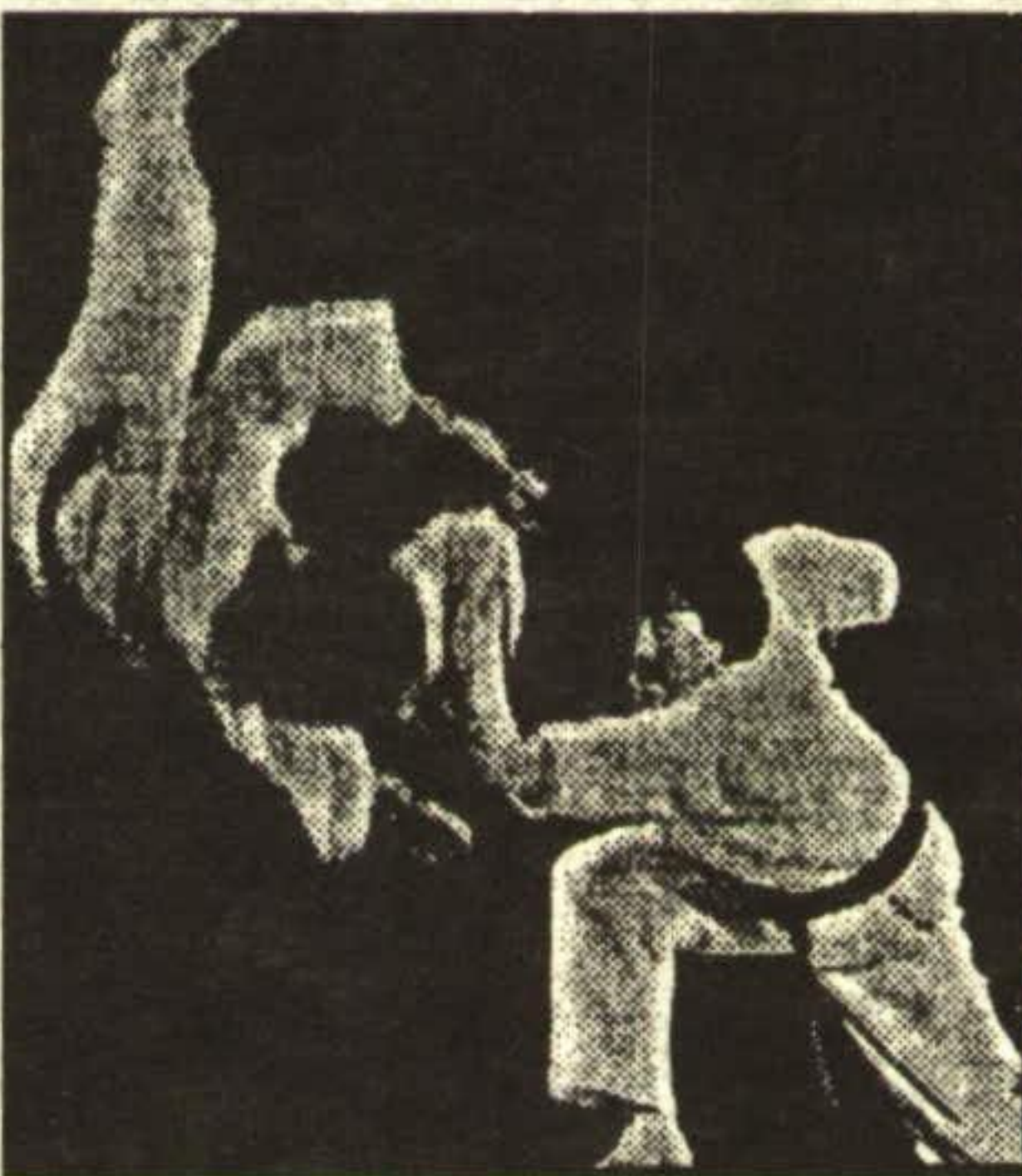

The Georgetown Chrysler Raiders had their losing streak stretched to five games Tuesday evening in Streetsville with a heart-breaking 4-3 loss to the Derbys.

The defeat, Georgetown's third to Streetsville in as many games this season, drops the local Junior A squad to a 3-13 record in Central Ontario Provincial Junior A West Division play.

Despite some solid goaltending by Paul Stinnett and a third-period power-surge for the visiting crew, the Raiders just can't seem to buy themselves a win these days.

The two teams exchanged goals in the opening period before Streetsville mounted a 3-1 lead after two frames of action. Georgetown allowed another quick

goal in the third period but stormed back with two of their own and made a good comeback attempt, but to no avail.

Leading the way for the Raiders was Ian Ellis who notched two goals while Trevor Brandt, back from a two-game suspension, scored the other marker. Brandt missed on a penalty shot in the second period.

Picking up assists were Brandt, Will North, Doug Sheppard, Dave Milek and Ryan Brown.

Georgetown played in Burlington on Friday and at home to Oakville Saturday.

They begin a two-game home stand on Friday (November 19) at 8 p.m. against Royal York. Saturday the Raiders host Hamilton at 7:30 p.m.
