**Whiting says 5 % rollback  
would have been simpler**

"I agree they needed to find the money but I think there could have been a simpler approach," he said. The provincial government "should have stuck to a (5 per cent) rollback. Everybody's salary would have been less, but there would be no days off and it would have been a much easier approach to it."

He pointed out there are still two years to go in the three year social contract cutbacks, and the negotiations for the next two years are continuing.

The school board had to negotiate separately with each group and came up with separate solutions.

The caretakers, for example, will have to take nine days off, while the secretaries have to take only three or four, Howitt said.

When schools are open a caretaker has to be on hand, and because the schools are closing between Christmas and New Year's, the daycare facilities in some newer schools will be affected. A nursery school program at M.Z. Bennett may be affected, Whiting said, but he doesn't know how yet.

The Halton board wanted to get the issue finalized so everyone, including parents, students and teachers, would know what is happening, Howitt said.

**Office ransacked**

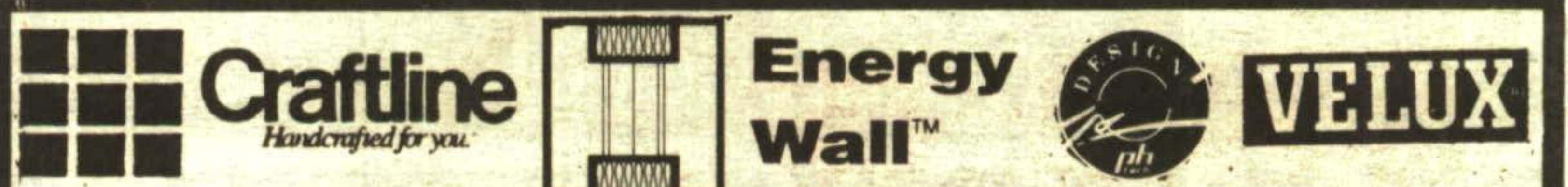
