

Park School secretary Vi Ashcroft said things have come full circle since she started working at Park School 25 years ago.


Ashcroft started working at Park School in 1969, just after she and her family moved to the Limehouse area from Toronto.

"He was Mr. Personality. I think we had more parent volunteers at the school each day than we had students," Ashcroft said. "All those moms that were home all day just loved it. It was always interesting to see who would come to the school."

Things have changed a lot over the years. Ashcroft said that the work load is basically about the same as when she started, even though computers and a network for all the schools has come in.

The job is always the same, but also changing: new students come each year, and she likes that.

MEXICAN CASSEROLE

6 chicken legs or breasts on the bone

2 cups chicken stock

1 cup wild rice uncooked

1/2 cup corn kernels

2 zucchini cut into 1/2" pieces onion cut into 1/2" pieces

red pepper cut into 1/2" pieces

tablespoon olive oil

11/2 teaspoons cumin

11/2 teaspoons chili powder 11/2 teaspoons ground coriander

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

125g shredded mozzarella cheese

1) Preheat oven to 350°. In small bowl stir cumin, chili powder, coriander, salt & pepper. Pour half of spices on to separate plate. Rub both sides of chicken in half of spice mixture.

2) Heat oil over medium heat, add chicken in batches and brown 5 minutes each

3) Sprinkle rice over bottom of 9 x 13" pan. Pour in stock. Add zucchini, onion, red pepper, corn and remaining spices. Stir to mix. Place chicken over vegeta-

4) Cover dish and bake in centre of oven for 1 hour. Uncover, sprinkle with cheese & bake uncovered for 10 minutes until cheese melts.


