# Brookville teachers win Prime Minister's Award for teaching excellence

Three Brookville School teachers have won the prestigious Prime Minister's Awards for Teaching Excellence in Science and Mathematics. Joanne Harris, Elizabeth McLeod and Robert Moulder of Brookville Public School claimed three of only seven Prime Ministers Awards given to teachers

in the Region of Halton.

Working as a team, the Brookville teachers developed the Crane Unit of study that integrates mathematics, science, design, and technology concepts. Students apply these concepts to solve realistic, practical problems. As a result of the program, students develop positive attitudes toward mathematics, science, design and technology. The unit was developed for Brookville students who first used the unit last spring, but the teaching unit has since been shared with other schools in the region.

The awards are intended to honor Canada's best teachers and are given to elementary and secondary teachers who have had a major, proven impact on student performance and interest in science, technology, and mathematics.

Award recipients receive a Certificate of Excellence and congratulatory letter from the Prime Minister, as well as a cash award. One third of the cash award is given to the school, while two thirds of the cash award is given to the educator for professional development and other teaching aids to help outstanding teachers continue to make a difference to their schools.
